Uganda Project

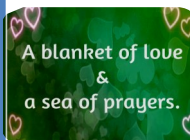

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS (RCIA) will conclude the Inquiry Process on Tuesday, October 16 at 7:00 P.M. in the Parish Living Room. It will be for about one hour. These sessions are designed for those who have an interest at all of becoming a Roman Catholic to join others and seek some answers and ask questions about the Catholic Church. On Tuesday, October 23, we will begin our catechetical sessions in preparation for the Easter Sacraments. Those interested are invited to come to the Inquiry Sessions. We are also seeking team members for this year's RCIA sessions. 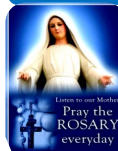
