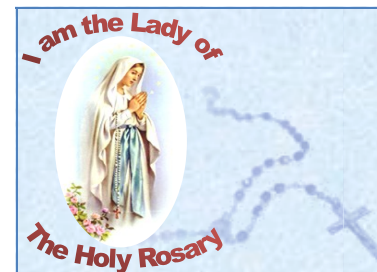
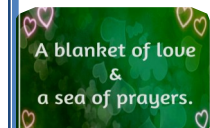

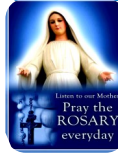

GOOD NEWS:

WE ARE SO BLESSED WATER IS FLOWING IN UGANDA

You probably have all heard the exciting news that finally, after drilling several times, a well was successfully drilled for my village community in Uganda. It is located about 0.5 miles (about 800 meters) away from the central part of the village, where we originally intended to drill it. Fortunately is it a good high yield well that can be used to supply water to other areas of the village. The well has been designed to have both manual hand pump and electric pump (which can be powered by solar energy or a generator). This weekend they are casting the concrete and installing the manual hand pump. It will be ready for use by the villagers by this coming Monday or Tuesday. I will share with you the photos and more details of the finished well next weekend.

The water committee will meet this week to discuss the next phase of the project, that is, piping it to the central area of the village, where the wider community can easily assess the water.

I wish to thank Msgr. Tim, the members of the parish pastoral council, the water committee members and all of you, the parishioners of Holy Rosary Parish for the support, generous contribution and prayers for the success of this project. Yes, the good Lord has indeed answered our prayers and may He bless you most abundantly and grant all your intentions!
