- ⇒ Wash outside windows, paint exterior door, clean one gutter, fill bird feeders 3 hour project
- ⇒ Cut down overgrown brush and haul away 5-8 hour project
- ⇒ Scrape and Paint south exterior wall of home 5-8 hour project
- ⇒ Paint 8 x 12 shed (no trim to paint) 2-3 hours
- ⇒ Build new porch swing (resident has woodworking tools), wash outside windows, pressure wash deck 5-10 hours
- ⇒ trim hedges and haul away trimmings 4-5 hours
- ⇒ remove river rock and install landscape fabric 2-3 hours
- ⇒ Install vinyl plank flooring in Kitchen 5-8 hours (this is a guess)
- ⇒ mow lawn, cut up fallen wood (used to cook and heat), remove brush 4-5 hours
- ⇒ remove flower bed landscape timbers and install new timbers – 5-8 hours
- ⇒ paint exterior basement block (4-5 hours), weed whack brush around property (2-3 hours) paint garage trim, pressure wash deck

UGANDA UPDATE

One June 18th, the Uganda Mission Committee (virtually) voted unanimously to forward the remaining funds of \$5100 to Fr. Andrew's parish in Warroad. This fund was set aside as a priority for a maintenance fund. Father Andrew will be the administrator of that fund. He has a person in his home village that monitors the pumps and panels. Father Andrew's northern Minnesota parishes have heard of Holy Rosary's success. Warroad has already had a fund raiser last fall. A community group there asked members of our committee to visit with them at a meeting in Warroad to give them background information and help them "get started." We were all excited about that...the Covid 19 hit! Now things are on hold until we all feel safer. (Father's village in Africa is almost untouched by the virus!) Think...

Greetings on the 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time,

Welcome to Holy Rosary. I am excited to be here and celebrate with you. I am coming off 6 weeks of a sabbatical that allowed me to reconnect with family and friends. I had to remind myself it is OK to be mellow and slower than normal. I am looking forward to getting to know the parish community. You might be like me and need to be reminded of names more than once. I have 6 years before I retire so I will work hard at listening and responding to your requests. I love the sacraments, so I encourage you to come to Mass, confession and to be anointed. These powerful sacraments are God's way of saying "I Love You". Every time you receive a sacrament God is reaching out and touching your soul and life. I will remind you: Jesus loves you!

It is our prayer that summer celebrations will be joy filled and safe. Barbeque is the word of the day! Charcoal is the preferred style. In any case relax and enjoy friends and family. Social distancing in place of course.

In this weekend's Gospel: Jesus tells us He is meek and humble of heart. We as disciples are called to be like Him, to emulate Him, to show the world we live our faith. I love the stories people share about encountering Jesus in everyday life. When we review our day, we can see God in action or when we sit in silence and listen, we can hear God at work, talking to His creation. Can you share a story of where you saw or heard Jesus in our world, in this time and in this place?

It is a danger in our noisy, busy world that we may take the Eucharist for granted. When you receive Holy Communion ask yourself: How will this encounter with the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus change me? Our faith tells us it is an encounter with Jesus. When we receive the Eucharist, we are called to change whatever it is in our life that does not reflect the way Jesus calls us to live. He desires us to be holy, happy, and healthy people. It is important that we do not confuse the gift and the giver. Here is a quote from The Gift and the Giver by Edward Farrell.

We ask for a piece of sand
and he gives us a beach.
We ask for a drop of water
and he gives us an ocean.
We ask for time
and he gives us life eternal.
And it is so easy for us
to fall in love with the gift
and forget the giver.

Dear Parishioners,

As we look to bring out students back to the building safely this fall during the COVID-19 pandemic, one of the initiatives we need to take on over the summer is replacing our water fountains with fountains that have an automatic water bottle filling station. This will minimize the use and the touching of the fountains which will provide our students with a safe way of getting drinking water. This comes at a good time as our fountains are at a point where they should be replaced anyway. We hope to purchase similar units as what was recently donated by the Fr. Don Braukmann family and is currently located in the Welcoming Center. We have 4 fountains that need replacing in the school. The cost of 1 water fountain is about \$1,000. Installation could cost as much as \$1,300. I have started a fund to begin saving for this endeavor over the summer and currently have \$500 from one generous donor. If your family or organization would like to make any sort of contribution, it would be greatly appreciated! A check can be mailed to the school or given to Mary at the parish office. Please be sure to include a note that says it is for our water fountain fund. Thank you so much for considering a contribution – every little bit will help!

In addition, please be sure to pick-up a copy of our annual "State of the School" report, which is located at both entrances of the church and at the school office window. This report will provide information about our School Strategic Plan progress, upcoming improvement initiatives, a financial report, assessment data, enrollment trends, and ways we live out our School Mission Statement through faith development opportunities and service.

Thank you for your ongoing support of our parish school. Holy Rosary School is blessed by such a caring and helpful church community, and we are so grateful. May God bless you for all that you do!
