Greetings,

In our gospel this weekend Jesus has problems with family and relatives. They thought they knew Him and were unable to get beyond their preconceived ideas as to how He should act and function when around them. There are times in our lives when someone close to us has accomplished something completely unexpected. Our reaction will range from congratulations to utter disbelief.

Do you remember the "Britain's Got Talent" show when the middle-aged woman Susan Boyle walked on stage and the audience and judges laughed due to her appearance? Then she blew their minds as she sang with a voice filled with volume, feeling and power. Later comments were: "beauty is always within... I never expected such a performance from such a lady"...

I think about my son whose whole outlook on life changed when his daughter was born. I am still shocked when I observe how well he interacts with her and how he is so protective, just like one would desire every parent should be. The tendency to judge others unfairly is not new... it happened to Jesus it can happen to us and we can also be the ones who judge others unfairly... the impact on Jesus was that He was unable to perform mighty deeds there. What is the impact of our judgment on others? Do we hold them back for achieving all they are capable of achieving.

Here is a random thought to contemplate and may be put into action: *Do you tend to talk more than listen? Just for today, try to listen to your spouse or children as much as you talk to them.*

Here is a prayer I frequently say at the conclusion of prayers with someone who is suffering: Father in heaven, grant (name) comfort in his/her suffering. When he/she is afraid, give him/her courage, when afflicted, give him/her patience, when dejected, afford him/her hope, and when alone, assure him/her of the support of your holy people. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen

These families have relied on the income from their religious hand carved olive wood artifacts to tourist. So we have come to the USA to try to help support these families by bringing their artifacts here to sell in the USA. All the proceed from sales will be sent back to the families of the Holy Land so that they may be able to keep their homes and provide their families. The last few years were very tough for the Christian families, and this is the only source of income for them.
