



The Cardinal's Nest Holy Rosary After-School Care

This year, Holy Rosary School is offering after-school care for our families. The Cardinal's Nest After-School Program will provide children in grades K-6 with a safe and inviting place to spend time in the company of other children to create and play in a healthy atmosphere. Afternoons will include time for outdoor play/physical activity, quiet study, reading, snacks, and indoor activities. We are looking for students in grades 7 – 12 who would like to help with our after-school childcare program, Monday – Friday, 3:15 – 5:30 p.m. Assistants would be responsible for helping the coordinators with activities, prepping snacks, overseeing homework time, and supervising and playing with children. You will receive a stipend equal to \$8.25/hour (or \$16.50/day), and the money earned will be put in a fund in your name to be used for church/school activities, retreats, camps, etc. After you have completed the Confirmation program, any leftover funds will be dispersed to you. Going Forth As Disciples

Thank you Deacon Mark Krejci for joining us this weekend to further expand on the vision of "Going Forth As Disciples." Your message further validates what we read and hear to go forth as disciples.

Reading through the Diocesan Newspaper, Our Northland Diocese, AKA the OND, there are many references to "Going Forth as Disciples." The scripture readings this weekend, and most weekends, reference our mission to be disciples of Jesus to everyone.

Question.... When does our mission as disciples begin? Fr. Chuck shared last Sunday the answer.... At Baptism. At our baptism we are a new creation, freed from Original Sin and given the gift of the Holy Spirit to go forth to proclaim the Gospel message. Baptized infants are not aware of the gift, but it beams from them at all times; we are attracted to infants as they represent God's handiwork as a disciple. A quote from the OND by Mollie Bye, a JPII Staff Member, says this well, "God doesn't call the qualified, he qualifies the called." Let that quote rest in your heart for a minute.... "God doesn't call the qualified, he qualifies the called." This is so true. Reflect on the disciples and the occupations they were called from; several were fishermen, and not the best at fishing, another a tax collector, and others possibly tradesmen. Remember Jesus, he was an infant in this world that attracted many, just like each one of us as an infant. So what happens as we grow? Why do some of us tend to drift away from God's call at baptism? He's always calling us to Himself. Maybe today's Gospel reading is an example.

Jesus taught the disciples that He must suffer greatly, rejected by the elders, the chief priests and the scribes and be killed. Then the disciple Peter took Jesus aside to rebuke, or reprimand Him. Then here is Jesus' reply "You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." Hmm... that sounds much like me. Thinking like a human being, rather than responding to God's call. Which plan is more fulfilling? My plan for my life, or God's plan for my life? The fulfilling plan for my life is **God's plan**. The less fulfilling plan for my life is my plan. How does a person know if the current plan is fulfilling God's plan?

Two weeks ago, four men from Holy Rosary, including myself attended a retreat at the Abbey of Hills in Marvin, SD, formerly Blue Cloud Abbey, a Benedictine Monastery. The lay apostolate schedules two retreats every year, the next retreat is March 2022 in Hankinson, ND. Much of the weekend included speakers presenting on the burdens that weigh us down, also known as the monkey on our backs, or the failures and sin we carry with us that satan uses to tell us we are not worthy of God's love. Saturday evening was a healing service where four retreat staffers pray over any retreatant that desires healing. They first ask for healing requests, they pray and they ask again for healing requests, they pray and they ask again for healing requests and continue to pray. The purpose of the multiple requests, is to drill down to the most painful hurts to be healed. For myself, I can't speak for the other three men, but waking up Sunday morning, I felt 10-15 lbs lighter. I know I wasn't 10-15 lbs less weight, but the burdens I carried were lifted off me. The men praying over me for about 15 minutes invoked God to take on my burdens. This is one example confirming I am following God's plan for my life. How did this all come about? A fellow Holy Rosary parishioner called me to consider the retreat, I responded and from that point on God's plan took full effect. The sacrifice on my part was taking a vacation day on Friday from work, spending a summer weekend away from home, not sleeping in my own bed, the \$250 cost for the retreat and other "thinking as human beings do" sacrifices.

My experience may be similar to Wyatt Carlson, age 13, from Holy Rosary who attended JPII camp The paragraph from the OND, "Spiritually, Carlson wanted to make a stronger connection to God, and he found listening to music sung during times of camp worship helped him connect better with God." At every stage or moment in our life, God is calling us. Wyatt responded to the call to attend JPII Camp this summer, as did other middle schoolers attending the camp. Did Wyatt make sacrifices? My guess he did for the week long camp, choosing to take a week out of his summer to follow God's plan. There is a lot of faith in this young man and fellow campers.

Now the question... How about you? Cursillos for both men and women are coming up on the schedule. If not possible, how about a men's retreat at Demontreville, in Lake Elmo, MN (north of St. Paul.) a Jesuit Retreat House. Listen for the call.... God's plan for your life is much more fulfilling. If you didn't hear God's call, reread the last four sentences.
