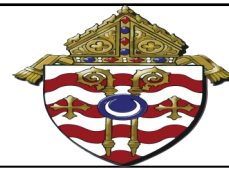

**Welcome all parishioners and visitors to Holy Rosary this wonderful month of Mary. Both May and October are months to recognize our Blessed Mother and all that She is for the Church, as the patron saint of the United States and as our Mother.**

Today we hear in the Old Testament reading of the Book of Wisdom three initial statements that begin with: I Prayed...I Pleaded...I Preferred... But for what? I Prayed, I Pleaded, I Preferred... WISDOM. What is Wisdom? The longing to know the end result of prayer, pleading for a personal, preferred request, for an expected outcome. We are all searching for Wisdom, yet Wisdom is found in trusting God with our lives. Surrender to God's will for yourself. Think back, how many times did you conceive of the worst possible outcome was expected from a hopeless situation, then in the end, the worst possible outcome never transpired. And later you shared the entire story with family or friends the Wisdom you acquired from the experience.

The man in today's Gospel reading is giving the disciples and us a moment to acquire Wisdom. The man ran up to Jesus and knelt down before him asking, "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus inquired about the man keeping the commandments of Moses, the man replied that he has observed them from his youth. Then Jesus states, "You are lacking one thing." Jesus continued on to the point out the one thing, from that the man's face fell and he went away sad. Jesus asked the man that had many possessions, that he should rid the possessions from his life and follow Jesus.

For me I need to recognize those things that block me from following Jesus more closely. Activities that are in excess such as playing the game Spyder Solitaire on the phone, searching the internet for classic cars, watching NASCAR, Vikings football, TV News, searching for vacation destinations are a few examples. These are examples of excess. I am challenging myself to cut the time I spend on these activities by a certain percentage. Maybe 10%, 25% or 50%.... That time will be redirected to grow closer to Jesus, through scripture reading, completing the book, The True Devotion to Mary then begin the book, Consecration to St. Joseph, and renew the daily Holy Hour in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament are a few examples of cutting excessive time from the less than fruitful activities to spend time with our Lord, which is hundred times more fruitful.

Further in the Gospel, the disciples turn to Jesus and say they have given up everything to follow Him. Jesus replies to the disciples in a context they would understand. Let's take the words from Jesus for you to fill in the blanks for your life. Jesus says, "Amen, I say to you, there is no one who has given up \_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_ for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not receive a hundred times more now in this present age: \_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_, with persecutions, and eternal life in the age to come." Jesus lists off several examples in the first series of blanks for the disciples and He repeats those same examples in the second series of blanks.

I have a personal example from this past weekend. At 11 am Mass, Fr. Chuck announced that Jim and Lynn Wolf are receiving a special blessing as Diocesan Married Couple of the Year. My plan was to attend the event, but forgot it was Oct 3rd. The first thing that went through my mind... I am going to miss the NASCAR race and the Vikings game. Keep in mind, following God's plan is much better than following my plan. Surrender to God's plan. After celebrating the event with Jim and Lynn in Crookston at the Cathedral, it was reported that the Vikings lost the game and the NASCAR race was postponed to Monday, due to rain. I received a hundred times more by following God's plan to celebrate with Jim and Lynn, avoiding the suffering of a Vikings game and able to listen to the entire NASCAR race Monday. This may seem trivial, but if I would have stayed home, not going to Crookston, I would have regretted not being at the celebration for Jim and Lynn. This is Jesus' message and my piece of WISDOM, follow God's plan to receive a hundred times more and eternal life in the age to come.
