Have you ever noticed that a baby or a small child has no problem letting the world know what they need and that their need is urgent? Their loud cry, their begging, and their sense of urgency, comes to my mind when I imagine Bartimaeus in today's reading.

Bartimaeus, a blind man, sat on the roadside begging. When he heard that Jesus was approaching, he began to shout out. The people in the crowd immediately began reprimanding him and telling him to be quiet. Bartimaeus persisted, calling out more loudly and with greater urgency. He was determined to not be silenced or deterred from getting Jesus' attention. Jesus acknowledged the faith of Bartimaeus and his request by restoring his sight.

How do we as adults generally respond to the behavior of a young child who is making it known that they have an immediate need? Most likely, we will do whatever we can to help fulfill that need. Jesus wanted to satisfy Bartimaeus' request, and similarly, God knows that we, His children, have needs also, and He wants what's best for us. In Philippians 4:6, we are told, "Don't worry about anything; instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need and thank Him for all he has done."

This same topic came up during our Morning Prayer together as a school this week. We were reading the Gospel story, Matthew 6:7-14, which addresses prayer. The reading says, "...your Father knows what you need before you ask Him", so my question to the students was, "If God knows what we need, then why do we need to pray?" They came up with some great answers - I'll share a few: "We pray because we need to thank Him for what He has done for us", "We pray because we love Him", "We pray because we want to talk to Him and have a relationship with Him", and "We have to pray for the needs of others". Within this discussion, we also talked about the fact that God is looking for us to acknowledge our needs and he wants us to ask Him.

When you have a need in your life, remember the example of Bartimaeus - don't be shy; speak up! Ask God persistently and with faith to fulfill your needs and He will respond. God bless!

**Master, I want to see...**  
 Life. Is. Complicated. I'm thankful for every day God gives me on this earth, but sometimes life is just HARD. Plans don't work out the way I want them to, people hurt me, I find myself stuck in pity parties where I can't seem to do anything right...does this ever happen to you? In the Gospel reading today we hear about Bartimaeus - he truly had a hard life. He was blind, he was alone, and he had to beg to survive, which in his time made him about as undesirable to others as he could get. Undesirable is a horrible title. Sometimes we might feel that way by our own opinion but how much worse would it be to know, by their actions, that others feel that way too? When Jesus was approaching, Bartimaeus took a chance and called out to Him, only to be rebuked by those around him. In their minds, his lowly status meant that he shouldn't "bother" Jesus. But at that point he had two choices...he could silence himself and let Jesus pass by or he could keep calling out to Him in the hope that Jesus would hear him. Bartimaeus chose to keep calling out...and Jesus DID hear him. And by his faith, Jesus healed him. Are there times in life when we are blind to our own blindness? Are there opportunities we don't take to be with and for others? Are there opportunities to heal hurts that we don't meet head on? We have the same choices Bartimaeus had - we can silence ourselves or we can keep calling out and allow Jesus to help us to see. Jesus simply willed for Bartimaeus to have his sight and it was restored. His will is to walk with us, to comfort us, to restore us to health. Jesus doesn't know undesirable. Jesus wants YOU. He wants GOOD for YOU. He's the person of love God sent to earth to show us how deep His love for us goes. How blessed we are to have the opportunity to know Him and to have a relationship with Him every day we choose to. And how open He is to love us, to heal us, to hold us in our times of need. To help us to see, to bring light to our blindness. It is in those hard times of life when we need Jesus the most. Jesus doesn't know undesirable. Keep calling out. Don't pass Him by.
