Diocesan and Community News

Diocesan staff and volunteers are preparing for the installation of the Most Reverend Andrew Cozzens on Monday, Dec. 6. Please note this is a ticketed event, not open to the public. Guests include clergy from the Diocese of Crookston, clergy from the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis, visiting bishops, consecrated religious, representatives of diocesan boards and councils, and friends and family of the bishop-designate. Everyone will be able to watch the installation and pray as one faith community. Those without tickets will be able to go online and watch vespers on Sunday, Dec. 5 at 6:30 p.m. and the Mass on Monday, Dec. 6 at 1 p.m. The livestream will be carried at crookston.org/newbishop, [facebook.com/DioCrookston](https://www.facebook.com/DioCrookston) and through a live broadcast on Real Presence Radio. **Mass on Dec. 8: Open to all!** An opportunity is open to everyone to welcome Bishop Cozzens to the diocese. All are invited to Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception on Wednesday, Dec. 8 for a Mass of Thanksgiving on the Patronal Feast of the Diocese of Crookston (Feast of the Immaculate Conception) beginning at 7 pm.

The Office of Formation in Discipleship is seeking to identify laity from around the Diocese who are willing to provide a “witness talk” describing their faith journey and how they seek to share the name and the love of Jesus in the world. We want to find a group of people from across the diocese who are seeking to live as missionary disciples. Perception... “the way of regarding, understanding, or interpreting something”

How do you perceive today’s Gospel? Do you see those that have more and give more, more important than those that give little? Do you tend to judge and overlook others by what they give? Do you praise those that give more? Do you appreciate the humble gifts of the poor?

God on the other hand perceives things differently. God determines the value of a gift by what the giver keeps, not what the giver gives. What pleases God comes from the inside, from the heart. He knows the motive of our giving. He wants more than our gifts; he wants our hearts. He wants us to give all of ourselves and He in return will take care of us.

Perhaps we need to consider changing our attitudes and our perceptions. God is asking us to live in total commitment to serving Him with a humble and generous heart, free from pride and prejudice. Give in faith. Faith that He will supply our needs and enable us to keep on giving. He will continue to give generously to us so we can continue to give generously. God can never be out done in generosity. For it was out of his generous heart that He gave his only begotten son to us, so that we may not perish but may have life eternal. When we give, it should be in gratitude for this gift which he has given us. There may be times that giving can be difficult but when we give, it opens doors for more blessings.

God is the One who gives us what we have in the first place. It all belongs to Him. When we give to Him, we honor Him by acknowledging that He is the Source of all our blessings. Ask Him to bless you with the grace to open your mind and heart and hands toward others in generously giving for they are refilled when they are open in giving what they contain.

This week I challenge you to ask yourself, “What are my copper coins, and how can I give them?”

The contrast between the self-serving lawyers and the widow in this week’s gospel couldn’t be any greater, and Mark’s weaving of these two stories together is, I think, where most of the meaning lies. The gospel is filled with examples of faith; examples to follow and examples to avoid like the plague. Jesus presents the scribes and lawyers as all about themselves. They want to be seen. They want to be congratulated. They want to be well-thought of. They want people saying good things about them to their faces AND behind their backs. They are, Jesus says, totally self-absorbed. And then there is the widow. Could there be a picture of someone more selfless than her? She doesn’t give out of her abundance, what’s left over, she gives from the very depths of her being. Her giving is sacrificial. Selfless. To me, this section of Mark isn’t rocket science. It’s about the kind of faith that we are supposed to have, and the kind of faith that we aren’t. Jesus proclaims that the woman who put in two small copper coins had given more than all the rich people. In a very real way, it is a summary of the whole Gospel, for God looks at the heart and its readiness to give generously. The faith of Jesus Christ isn’t a self-absorbed faith. It’s a faith that digs deep, a faith which is sacrificial, a faith which bears the cross. In short, the faith of Jesus Christ isn’t about us. It’s not about me. It’s not about you. It’s about what we give to God. And it’s about the amazing riches that God gives in return. It’s about a God who isn’t self-absorbed, a Christ that isn’t self-absorbed, and faithful Christians who aren’t self-absorbed. Whether we are professionally religious or not, we are to be the window. Loving, living, and giving sacrificially. So today, ask yourself: Do I think too much about what others think of me? Does this influence my behavior? Am I ashamed of who I am? Do I sit for a while with Jesus and honestly look at my life? Do I measure my worth by my external success, or am I free to look at my heart and be ready to be generous even in my poverty? I ask God to help us look at ourselves and at others as he looks at us. I ask Jesus for light and help to keep us all in the truth. Amen.
