Solemnity of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ Greetings,

Thanks for celebrating this great feast with us. I hope you were able to go on the procession with Jesus after Mass. We are the temple where He resides. Moses sprinkled the people after they listened to the commands of God and agreed to do all He had commanded them. Jesus had summed up the law in a phrase: Love God, Love neighbor.

Eberhard Arnold wrote: **"There is no law but love.** Love is joy in others. Therefore, it should be out of the question to speak about another person in a spirit of irritation or vexation. There must never be talk, either in open remarks or by insinuation, against anyone, or against their individual characteristics—and under no circumstances behind their back. Gossiping in one's family is no exception. Direct address is the brotherly or sisterly service we owe anyone whose weaknesses cause a negative reaction in us. An open word spoken directly to another person deepens friendship and will not be resented."

Galatians Chapter 5 says: "Love your neighbor... If you go on biting and devouring one another beware that you are not consumed" ... this reminds me of the need to talk about **Gossip.** It is a terrible thing. Gossip is a sin and should be brought to confession. The Galatians had the attitude: He is no better than us and then proceeded to bring him down... Attitude is everything when it comes to gossip. We can do it maliciously and with a holier than thou attitude... we can add to a story and not even know the facts, we can say something we know is a direct lie, the result is the same, we make someone look low and we imply we are better than they are.

Gossip is a sin. It is one thing to state a fact but the reason we even mention it is where we can cross the line into sin. "Tom is in the hospital" is an OK thing to say if we only take it that far... Tom is in the hospital because he won't take his meds properly and hasn't done a bit of exercise in his life and I hear he even kicks the dog! presumes things that may not be true and even if they are, is an unkind thing to say.

Sometimes families do not want to share information about an illness or an event that has happened and we need to respect that right. Personally, I make it a point to proactively share openly all the details so that everyone knows the facts.

All of us are used to hearing gossip. Help put an end to a malicious story. The simplest way is to not repeat it. Or have courage and say either: "I do not believe that for a moment" or "Are you sure about those facts, it sounds a little farfetched to me..." If you are a person who engages in gossip remember to do the opposite... say something good about the person to offset the damage that has been done to reputation or character.

I have learned that when someone feels the need to gossip; it is to make themselves feel better, or it is a sign of a difficulty within themselves. When we are the victim of gossip it is difficult and takes courage to move forward and forgive. We know we cannot right the wrong done to us or our reputation. When we succumb to our temptation to lash out, we become part of the continuing problem. Please remember the importance of forgiveness. It is hard to forgive especially when we cannot or will not separate the action from the individual. The Our Father is an amazing prayer and when I say it, I think about the words: Forgive us our trespasses as we...

It is my prayer we reflect on gossip and the drain it is on relationships and the wrong message it sends.

While receiving Jesus in the Eucharist at Mass is the most powerful encounter we can have with our Lord, Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is an incredible opportunity to grow in relationship with Him.

XLT is a devotion focused simply on that, growing deeper in our relationship with Jesus. XLT combines praise and worship, a message proclaiming the Word of God, and Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, where Jesus, present in the Eucharist, is placed on the altar for us to adore. Praise and worship are a powerful form of prayer since music has a way of reaching into the depths of our hearts. When we praise God, walls around our hearts come crashing down. When we sing to Him, every part of our being reaches out to God, who is reaching back to us to embrace us.

We begin XLT with praise and worship so we can fix our gaze on God and surrender to Him. Next, we spend time listening to a message, giving us something to reflect on, and allowing God to speak to each of us on the focus of the message. Finally, we adore our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, mixing praise and silence. To grow in any relationship, you must learn to give and receive, to speak and to listen. Both praise and silence are important, we sing to God our love for Him, and in the silence, He speaks His love to us.

Finally, we are sent out with a song of thanksgiving for what God has done for us, but most importantly for who He is and His love for us, so that we can carry that gratitude and continue to deepen that relationship in our everyday lives.
