Reflecting on today's Gospel reading. How often do we each plant seeds?

It is the beginning of the growing season. The seeds planted recently are in the process of germinating, to become the plant specifically identified on the package of seeds. What if the carrot seed you planted germinates to become lettuce? Would you be thankful or disappointed?

Another type of seed that we plant is through our words or actions with other people we meet. Maybe a child, a middle schooler, young adult, boyfriend, or girlfriend, maybe a stranger, or possibly a spouse, parent, grandparent or another relative or friend. We are planting seeds within those around us, maybe we know we are planting a seed or maybe we have no clue that we planted a seed. Each encounter we have with another person is an opportunity to plant a seed. Or maybe the seed is planted in you from another person? Did we recognize the seed was planted, if so, is the seed germinating?

The most important seed that is planted, is the seed God planted in each of us. The desire to know Him. We all have this seed in our soul. Have we allowed God to nourish the seed, give it water to grow the seed in us? Or, is the seed lying dormant? The seed that God plants in us does not die, it waits.

This past week a friend, Diana, entered eternal life. She taught third graders for 36 years. A lady with amazing ability to plant seeds. Regardless of the age of any person she met, Diana planted seeds with every encounter. People at the funeral shared how she planted seeds through gracious hospitality at her home, joyous personality, words of gratitude, words of praise at every accomplishment. Even when a person needed correction, Diana steered the person toward a better option. Diana had an amazing ability to gently plant a seed and many times gave the seed water to germinate immediately. A wonderful gift God gave to her... also know, that Diana allowed God to nourish and water the seed He planted in her soul.

The seed Diana received from God, was given to her freely, to do with what she desired. God gives us free will to live for Him or to live for ourselves. God is not disappointed with a seed that continues to be dormant, He's waiting... for you to have Him water the seed and to work in your life.

A verse in today's Second Corinthians reading, "walk by faith and not by sight." Diana walked by faith and literally, not by sight the past 15 years, due to macular degeneration of the eyes. She accepted the poor eyesight without complaint. Diana, continued to bake, crochet, plant flowers, plus many other activities including living in her home.

About a year ago, Diana's health began to decline. Her daughter was able to be present with Diana due to Covid restrictions at her own job, that permitted her to work remotely, and to care for Diana. The seed Diana planted within her own daughter, also an elementary teacher and teacher's coach, grew like the mustard seed to blanket Diana with comfort and love during this time. Sometimes, you reap what you sow.

Another Corinthians verse, "while we are at home in the body, we are away from the Lord, for we walk by faith and not by sight." Home in the body means living in our human body on earth. We are not yet home in the presence of the Lord in heaven. So, we walk by faith in the Lord not knowing what heaven looks like. This summer when we travel across Minnesota, we know our destination when we see the water tower of that city. When we travel the road of faith, it is sometime difficult to see our home in heaven, our final and preferred destination. Remember there are two final destinations of eternal life.

Consider this...freely allow God to nourish and water the seed He planted in your soul. Give HIM permission to do His will within you. It takes courage to live a new way, surrendering your will, to live as He wills for you. Walk by faith and not by sight to reach the preferred destination to be with our Lord Jesus.
