## Diocesan and Community News

Many thanks to those who have contributed to the Schulze Family Foundation Challenge to benefit Holy Rosary School. So far we have raised \$12,725. This will be posted weekly in the bulletin, on the screens before Masses and on Evangelus for the duration of the challenge to keep you informed of our progress. To be eligible for the \$25,000 matching grant from the foundation we must reach \$25,000 or more in new donations. If you haven't given to the school in the past, this is a great opportunity to make every dollar count!

Diocesan staff and volunteers are preparing for the installation of the Most Reverend Andrew Cozzens on Monday, Dec. 6. Please note this is a ticketed event, not open to the public. Guests include clergy from the Diocese of Crookston, clergy from the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis, visiting bishops, consecrated religious, representatives of diocesan boards and councils, and friends and family of the bishop-designate. Everyone will be able to watch the installation and pray as one faith community. Those without tickets will be able to go online and watch vespers on Sunday, Dec. 5 at 6:30 p.m. and the Mass on Monday, Dec. 6 at 1 p.m. The livestream will be carried at crookston.org/ newbishop, facebook.com/DioCrookston and through a live broadcast on Real Presence Radio. All are invited to Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception on Wednesday, Dec. 8 for a Mass of Thanksgiving on the Patronal Feast of the Diocese of Crookston.

On November 27 and 28 we will be taking our annual St. Mary's Mission Appeal collection. The school enrolls one hundred nineteen children this year and are receiving a quality education, formation in life skills and Catholic values and a chance at a bright future. Please give generously. readings we hear about Jesus coming in on clouds, how "every eye will see him, even those who pierced him. All the peoples of the earth will lament him."

As I read the readings the first time, my thoughts went to those who were there during his crucifixion, who pierced Jesus in his side. After reading it over and over, a deeper meaning started coming through. While we can often think of Jesus suffering on the cross and having his side pierced, who do you see holding the spear?

Has there been times that it was you or I? Every time we go against God's will, are we in fact holding the spear? Every time we do something wrong, especially knowing what we did was wrong, we drive that spear in a little farther. Therefore, everyone will "lament" and be filled with grief and sorrow when he comes.

Then, in the gospel, we hear about Pilate questioning Jesus, asking Him if he was a king. Jesus replies, "my kingdom is not of this world, and after Pilate says, "so you are a king." Jesus says, "for this I was born and for this I came into the world to testify the truth, everyone who belongs to the truth, listens to my voice."

I often wonder what went through Pilate's mind. He did not want to crucify Jesus as he saw no wrongdoing, however, Pilate was so concerned with power that he "passed the buck" and then washed his hands of the crucifixion of Jesus.

If Jesus was to come tomorrow, are we ready? Will we be excited and full of joy or will we "lament?" Perhaps this Sunday would be a great time for some reflection as we prepare for what is to come.

Not all is dark and gloomy in today's readings. Next week we change colors for the start of Advent. We look forward to Christmas and Jesus' birth. It is an opportunity for us to reflect on what we all endured through over the past year, and give thanks to the Lord our God for all that we have. As Jesus said, "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the one who is and who was and who is to come, the almighty." I really enjoy Advent, as it gives me so much to look forward to, and so much to be thankful for. I start to think of the readings that are to come. the excitement of hearing of Jesus birth and all those who traveled to see this wonderful gift of life. Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. May your Advent be filled with blessings and the Holy Spirit as we begin this season's journey together.

I probably read today's readings at least 10 times each. In the first two A blessed and happy Sunday to you! Today is the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. You may have heard it more commonly referred to as the feast of Christ the King. Today's feast day has always been an exciting one on the Church calendar for me. It's the last Sunday in Ordinary Time (Yes! A change to a new color in the church!), and it's the last Sunday before Advent begins (Yes! Christmas is coming!) After doing a little research on the history of today's Solemnity and then reflecting on what this feast day means for me. I've learned there are two better reasons to be excited about Christ the King Sunday.

> #1. In 1925, Pope Pius XI instituted today's feast day in response to growing secularism and nationalism in the world. Here are just few things that were happening at this time:

- Jan 3 Benito Mussolini dissolves parliament and becomes a dictator.
- Feb 27 In Munich, Adolf Hitler resurrects his political party.
- Aug 8 As many as 40,000 members of the Ku Klux Klan parade in Washington DC. The Klan has an estimated 5 million, making it the largest fraternal organization in the United States.
- **Nov 16** In New York, the American Association for Advancement of Atheism is formed.

It's clear that our world needed to hear (and still does) that Jesus is the King of the Universe. Thank you. Pope Pius XI.

**#2.** Celebrating that Jesus Christ is King of the Universe means we recognize that He is the King of: "all existing matter and space considered as a whole; the cosmos". Yep, Jesus is the ruler and King over EVERYTHING, and that includes all of us. He is the "Alpha and the Omega . . . the one who is and who was and who is to come, the almighty" (Rev 1:8). As the King's son or daughter, we should give Him permission to rule over us: our physical body, our intellect, our emotions, our joys, our failures, our sufferings, EVERYTHING. Life is so much easier when we let Jesus have His way and not ours. So, celebrate this beautiful Solemnity today in a special way. Maybe with a favorite feast or dessert in honor of our King, or by intentionally asking Jesus to be the Ruler of your family and home. The feast of Christ the King is therefore not a feast of those who are

subjugated, but a feast of those who know that they are in the hands of the one who writes straight on crooked lines. ~Pope Benedict XVI

repetitive work and may be lifting over 40 pounds. If you would like to volunteer please contact the Parish Office on what days you can help.


