Happy Third Sunday of Ordinary Time! This Sunday we hear Jesus proclaiming himself as fulfillment of the Law and the prophets. What Law are we referring to? The Old Testament, the Law of the Hebrews, gives testimony to the coming of the Messiah. The Messiah is foreshadowed throughout the Old Testament to rescue the Jewish people from persecution. Jesus is the New Covenant given by God.

Jesus reads from Isaiah... *The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord.* Jesus is pointing to himself as the Messiah, without saying that He is the Messiah. The past few Sundays, others have pointed to Jesus as the Son of God.

- At Christmas, the shepherds pointed to Jesus as the Son of God.
- At the celebration of the Holy Family, Mary and Joseph are protective parents of the Savior.
- At the Epiphany, the King's journey to Bethlehem pointing to Jesus, the King, bringing valuable gifts.
- At the Baptism of the Lord, Jesus is baptized by John the Baptist in the Jordan River where the heavens open up and God the Father speaks, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased."
- At the Wedding Feast of Cana, Jesus' mother Mary points to Jesus as He is prompted by her to turn water into wine for the wedding feast to continue.

Today, Jesus proclaims his anointing, bringing glad tidings to the poor, to liberate captives, to heal the blind/sick, and to set free the oppressed. The revelation of Jesus to humanity was gradually revealed over 30 years with Jesus acknowledging his anointing by God. Next Sunday continues where today's Gospel reading leaves off. The people, filled with fury in the synagogue, drive Jesus out of town. Stay tuned!!!

Let me jump back to the last bullet point. My prior articles for the bulletin reference the work of Fr. John Riccardo, ACTS XXIX (ACTS 29). Fr. John Riccardo shares words from the early Fathers of the first centuries of the Church by comparing the D-Day landing in France to the birth of Jesus. Fr. Riccardo's question when showing a picture of the D-Day Landing... Why are these men running from the boats onto the shore? What are they there to do? The response is, these men came to FIGHT to free France from oppression/captivity of a German Dictator.

Fr. Riccardo shows another picture, one of the Holy Family with the new born Jesus. His question is... What did Jesus come to do? The answer is the same, Jesus came to FIGHT to liberate captives, heal the blind/sick and set free the oppressed. The early Fathers of the Church regularly stated that Jesus came to fight, to go to war for and free us from the grasp of Sin, Death, Satan and Hell. Prior to Jesus, Satan captured all God's people after death, no one went to heaven, because of the sin of our first parents, since they were deceived by the serpent in the Garden of Eden. Jesus came in disguise, human flesh, to deceive Satan just as Satan deceived our first parents.

My point here... Jesus was gradually revealed over 30 years to begin His active ministry by teaching 12 men and other followers in preparation for the New Covenant. We are in the year 2022. Give some thought as to how you are going to reveal Jesus to others. If you're looking for some help, consider the work of Fr. John Riccardo, ACTS XXIX. The Book of ACTS in our Bible ends at Chapter 28. His ministry is ACTS 29. We are writing the 29th book of ACTS ever since. Reveal Jesus to others... to be recorded in this Chapter of the Book of ACTS, along with St. Peter, St. Paul, St. John Paul II... you get the idea...
