When our students have the chance to sing this song during our school Masses, they really belt it out and often bounce to the beat. It is a favorite! How awesome that they have an opportunity to proudly proclaim that they will shine with the light of Jesus!

Today's Gospel reading brings us to the top of a high mountaintop where Jesus is transfigured before his followers: Peter, James, and John. His disciples sat in awe as their leader stood before them in clothing that radiated with light. They were both fascinated and frightened as they grappled to understand what was happening. Then, suddenly, a large cloud loomed above the mountain and casted a dark shadow over them. From the cloud, came the voice of God, announcing that Jesus was His son and that the disciples should obey Him.

This event foreshadowed Jesus' victory over death. It shed light on Jesus' divinity, and it gave the disciples hope. This brings me back to the song that our students love so much: *This little light of mine, I'm gonna let it shine, let it shine, let it shine, let it shine.* How can you shine with the light of Jesus? How can you let the love of Jesus shine through your actions? How can the light of Christ transform the darkness in your life right now? How can you bring the light of Jesus to those living in darkness? These are good questions to ponder as we prepare ourselves for the resurrection of our savior in the coming weeks.

May you always shine brightly with His light!

Transfiguration...a change of form...a change of appearance. When the disciples awoke on the mountain where Jesus had taken them to pray, the change in Jesus was extraordinary! Peter, James, and John were seeing Jesus in a new way, in all His glory as God's Son. As you listened to the account of Jesus's transfiguration, did it bring about a change in how you see Him? Did it strengthen your belief in who He really is? Or was it just another story you heard but found it difficult to connect to? If you're thinking "the last one - that's me!", I can relate. I tend to be a "seeing is believing" kind of person. The most recognized expert could provide me with information, and I would still feel better if I could see or experience for myself. Maybe it's a trust thing, I don't know, but roughly 6 years ago I was in the same situation when it came to prayer. I was among a group of women who were discussing prayer and how it impacted their life, and I found myself thinking "I pray, some...but I wouldn't call it an impact on my life." It was something I did because it was the right thing to do to thank God or to ask forgiveness when things went wrong. But for them it was so much more than that - it was a connection to the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. I honestly didn't get it, I really didn't. But I thought if I wanted to see or to experience it for myself it was going to be up to me to make that happen. Little by little, I opened up to prayer. I gave God the times my mornings didn't go well (complained to Him is probably a more accurate description, but it was a start). I started to offer Him my attention when the car in front of me couldn't go faster than 20 miles an hour or I timed the train wrong AGAIN! And over time, unbeknownst to me a bridge was being built. Soon it wasn't just me sharing this or spouting off that...God was responding. He provided the support of friends, reaching out when I would tell Him I was having a bad day. The lyrics of a song would pierce my heart, letting me know He was there when it didn't feel like anyone else was. Relationship happened, I responded too...and from that change occurs. And then I started intentionally talking to Jesus...if you're not doing this, I HIGHLY recommend it! I'm eternally grateful for the day God planted a seed through that group of ladies.
