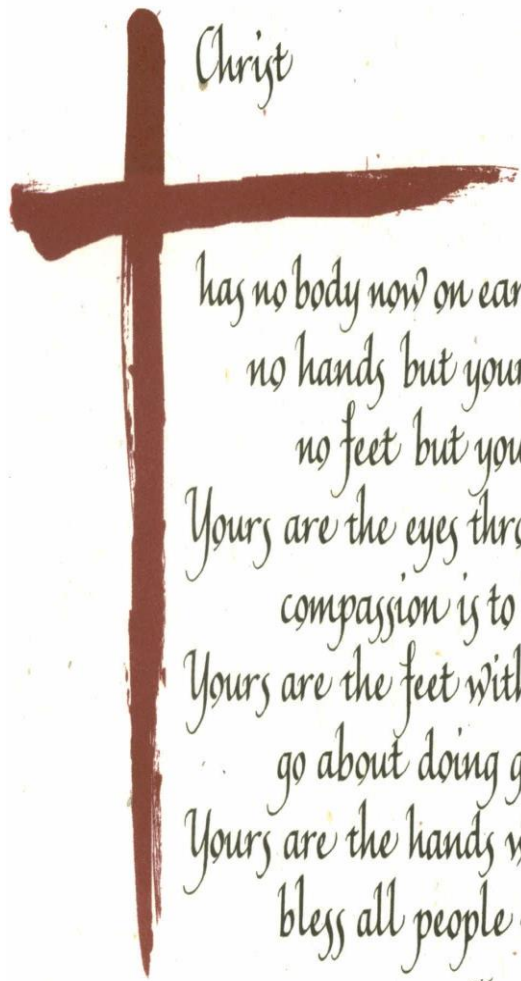

LITURGICAL MINISTRIES

SACRISTAN: Organize and instruct liturgical ministers before Mass, finding subs as needed. Keep the sacristy quiet and prepare the credence table for the Eucharistic celebration.

GREETER/USHER: Greet those arriving for Mass, help seat people as needed, assist with weekly collections and straighten up the church and common areas after Mass.

ALTAR SERVER: Youth Grade 3 and older who have received their First Holy Communion are welcome to serve at the altar for weekend and special Liturgies.

LECTOR/READER: Proclaim the Word and Intercessions at weekend and special Liturgies.

MINISTER OF HOLY COMMUNION: Assist in distributing the Body and Blood* of Christ to the congregation during Holy Communion.

*There may be times the Precious Blood is not distributed

MEDIA: Advance the screens that display songs and prayers during weekend and special Liturgies. Start and end the live stream for Saturday Mass and special occasions.

FUNERAL ASSISTANT: Assist in the flow of funeral Masses. Help seat attendees as needed, prepare incense for Final Commendation, and straighten up the church after the Mass.

MUSIC MINISTRIES

CANTOR: Lead the congregation in song at weekend or special Liturgies.

ACCOMPANIST: Musicians who play piano, organ, guitar, winds, brass, strings or percussion during Masses with the Cantor(s).

CHOIR: Choirs will be assembled again in the coming months.

YOUTH FAITH FORMATION

ELEMENTARY FAITH FORMATION

PK-6TH GRADE CATECHIST: Teach weekly faith formation classes to a group of 10-15 students in a classroom setting from mid-September through the end of April. Must be 18 years or older.

PK-6TH GRADE SUBSTITUTE CATECHIST: Fill in for a catechist when they are unable to teach. Must be 18 years or older.

PK-6TH GRADE CLASSROOM AIDE: Assist the catechist in the classroom.

PRAYER TESTER FOR GRADES 2-6: Test children on prayers in the hallway outside the classroom during Faith Formation.

OUTSIDE MONITOR: Be with children outside or in the Welcoming Center after Faith Formation classes to ensure safety as children are picked up.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD

CATECHIST: The catechist proclaims the Liturgy of the Word during 9:00am Mass on Sunday to children ages 4-Grade 2 in the Parish Living Room. Children are returned to church during the Offertory. Time commitment is as few as one to two Sundays per month. Lesson plan, materials and instruction are provided. Must be 18 years or older.

AIDE: Assist the catechist with managing the children who attend the Children's Liturgy of the Word during 9:00am Mass on Sunday. Time commitment is as few as one to two Sundays per month. Must be 6th grade or older.

Youth Ministry

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

**VBS is held each year at Holy Rosary in the early summer*

CREW LEADER: Accompany a group of 4-5 children to various stations and participate with them as they learn about the daily VBS theme. Must be 6th grade or older.

STATION LEADER: Teach a group of 10-15 children about the daily VBS theme. Stations include craft, snack, faith (Bible story), games and music. Lessons and materials are provided. Must be 9th grade or older.

MIDDLE & HIGH SCHOOL FAITH FORMATION

7TH-8TH GRADE SMALL GROUP LEADER: Lead a group of 5-8 students weekly in discussions and activities as directed by the catechist mid-September through the end of April. Open to Confirmed high school students and adults.

9TH GRADE CATECHIST: Teach YOU: Life, Love and the Theology of the Body. This program has videos with each lesson to present the content. Lead a group of girls or boys through discussion, questions, reading and activities. Usually done as a team with another adult. This program has great catechist support material. Must be an adult who has been Confirmed.

10TH-11TH GRADE CONFIRMATION SMALL-GROUP LEADER: Teach Confirmation using Chosen. This program has videos with each lesson to present the content. Lead a group of girls or boys through reflection, discussion, questions, reading and activities. Can be done alone or with another catechist. This program has great catechist support material.

FEEDING THE FAITH: Teens LOVE to eat! Help feed the kids before Faith Formation on Wednesday nights, either by donating snacks and supplies or cooking and serving a meal.

YOUTH EVENTS

CHAPERONES FOR EVENTS: A variety of events require extra adult help throughout the year. Chaperones are responsible for assisting in the well-being of the youth throughout an event. Duties include monitoring the behavior of youth while on trips, directing a small group, or assisting the director in whatever arises.

DRIVER FOR EVENTS: Sometimes events require youth to travel away from Holy Rosary. Drivers are needed to provide safe and responsible transportation of our youth to and from the event.

FAITH FORMATION CLASS SPEAKER: Sharing our experiences is one way God calls us to serve one another. Periodically we call on people to give a talk to our youth during their class time. We provide an outline of what we are looking for in the talk and help the speaker prepare. Most talks are 10-15 minutes in length.

ADORATION: Spend some time in prayer with Jesus on Tuesdays. The Blessed Sacrament is exposed after the 8:30 am Mass until 7pm. All are welcome!

TRANSPORTATION: Make a difference in the life of someone in need by driving them to appointments locally or in Fargo.

BUS DRIVER: Drive the KC bus to pick up parishioners who are unable to transport themselves to Mass on Saturday evening.

HELP RESIDENTS ATTEND MASS OR COMMUNION

SERVICES AT NURSING HOMES: Bring residents to Mass or Communion services at their nursing home – Diamond Willow, Ecumen, Oak Crossing and Pelican Landing.

COMMUNION DISTRIBUTION AT THE HOSPITAL: Visit Catholic patients at Essentia-St. Mary's. Pray with them and bring them the Body of Christ.

PRAYER CHAIN: Be on call to pray for those who have asked for prayers. Names and intentions won't always be shared; remember, God knows who and what we are praying for even when we don't know the details.

EMMAUS MINISTRY: More information to come as COVID subsides.

LUNCHROOM SUPERVISOR: Supervise students during their lunch period. Help the younger kids open cartons, etc. Pray with each class and dismiss them when their lunchtime is over. This is a daily need, September through May from 11:10-12:10.

PLAYGROUND SUPERVISOR: Assist the principal in supervising students during recess. This is a daily need, September through May from 11:30-12:30.

KITCHEN AIDE: Help prepare lunch for the students when one of the cooks is unavailable. This is an on-call need.

DISHWASHER: Wash dishes that were used during school lunch preparation and by students and staff as they finish eating. On-call substitute washers are also needed. This is a daily need, September through May from 11:00-1:00.

LAUNDRER TOWELS: Take home the towels from the school & parish kitchens at the end of each week and launder them.

CLASSROOM AIDE: Assist a teacher in his or her classroom as needed.

CARDINAL'S NEST ASSISTANT: This is a great opportunity for Middle or High School students to earn money for youth events! Play with the kids, help serve snacks and help kids with their homework from 3:30 to 5:30 Monday through Friday.

WEDNESDAY MORNING PRAYER: Join together with a group of our school parents on Wednesday morning at 8:15 (before school Mass) as they pray for student and teacher prayer requests that are collected throughout the week.

LUNCHTIME FILL-IN FOR THE OFFICE: Answer phones and assist visitors for a half hour over lunchtime. Ideally this time would be covered 2-3 days each week.

SORT RECEIPTS/UPCs: This project involves sorting and totaling Central Market “We Care” receipts, counting Our Family UPCs and counting and entering Coke pop tops online for our school to receive money from these organizations. Please also bring in these items from home as every bit helps those dollars add up for our school!

MARATHON FOR NONPUBLIC EDUCATION: This event is a major FUNdraiser for our school. Students and school families raise pledges to bike around the lake one Sunday in October. Volunteers are needed to drive around the lake and pick up anyone who might not be able to make it all the way around. We also need volunteers to set up and serve cookies and water at four water stops that are set up around the route, then tear down and return supplies to the school. Crossing guards to ensure the riders are safe at intersections are also needed. If you are unable to participate on the day of the Marathon, your monetary contribution to the Marathon is greatly appreciated!

GIVING HEARTS DAY: Giving Hearts Day is a primarily online-driven fundraiser that happens on the 2nd Thursday in February each year. Volunteer opportunities for this day are writing out thank you notes for donors and personally calling donors to thank them for contributing to our school. There are also opportunities to provide administrative support.

SPRING INTERLUDE: Our annual Spring Interlude takes place in the spring and has become an event enjoyed by many! There are many opportunities to volunteer to make this event successful – people are needed for the planning committee, to solicit and collect items for live and silent auctions, to plan decorations and set up the day of the event, marketing and design help...the list goes on. There really is something for everyone!
