The Catholic Church is deeply committed to protecting children from abuse and holding people accountable for inflicting such pain. In December 2021, the revised Book VI of the Code of Canon Law went into effect. This is the most recent of several documents that specifically address the issue of the abuse of children. Other documents include Vos estis lux mundi and Vademecum. These documents expand the acts which are considered abusive, clarify the manner in which the cases are processed, and hold people accountable for their action or inaction with regard to processing of a case. Of significant importance is attention given to the care of victim survivors and all who have been harmed. Bishops in the US lead the way for these changes with the implementation of the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People 20 years ago. Today every diocese and eparchy must have in place systems for tending to those who have been harmed, protecting those in our care and seeking restorative justice.

We have a common saying that expresses our insistence on tangible proof of every faith claim: "I'll believe it when I see it." And just when will that be? I ask myself, as I read this passage about Jesus' appearances to the disciples and then to Thomas. When will the moment come when we look up and really notice, really see the Risen Lord who stands before us in every room in our house, in every situation in our lives? He is, in fact, standing beside you right now as you read this. Have you noticed? There is so much we miss when we're looking down. In these two scenes (Jn. 20:19-23 and 20:24-29) taken together, there are a couple of crucial things we would miss.

*We would miss our Risen Lord's greeting.*

*We would miss His good news.*

We would miss the Risen Jesus' greeting: "Peace be with you." Well, now he's back, as promised. Now here he stands in the midst of his disciples whose hearts are both troubled and afraid, reminding them of the gift of peace which he has already given them.

If there are places in your life and that of your community where troubled thoughts and anxious visions of the future have banished peace, you will want to make sure you are looking up this Easter Season. Make sure you're in a posture where you can see and hear the Risen Lord standing before you expressing the way things are now, not wishful thinking: "Peace be with you." The Risen Lord brings peace. That's not something we want to miss out on simply because we are looking down.

**If we are not looking up, we might miss the Good News.**

If there are places in your life and in that of your community where injustice and violence seem to rule, you will want to make sure you are looking up this Easter Season so you can see and touch the wounds of the Risen Christ, visible signs of the ultimate victory of life over death that strengthen us for the smaller battles that lie ahead.

"I'll believe it when I see it," we often say. "I'll believe it when I see and touch it," says Thomas.

For years, I've yearned for more direct evidence. If I could feel Jesus' arm around my shoulder, maybe. If I could hear him say some audible words in my ear. If, when I closed my eyes, I could see his face or, better yet, if, when I opened them, he would be right there in front of me . . . But all I have to go on is faith. Fortunately, it is enough to nourish and sustain me day by day.

It has been one week since Easter, one week since chaos and excitement, one week since the empty tomb, one week since we proclaimed, **"Alleluia, Christ is Risen, He has truly Risen!"**

But it is one week after the resurrection and the disciples are in the same place they were Easter night. What difference has the empty tomb made for them? How has life changed them... how has it changed you? Has the empty tomb made a difference in your life? Is your life different? Do you see and engage the world in new ways? When I look at my own life it looks a whole like it did last Sunday, the week before, and the week before that. I can do better than that. I should be living the resurrection better, more powerfully, more fully, more authentically, than what I am. **"The Lord is risen indeed. Alleluia."** But then I realize it will take time and a starting point.

Your starting point is whatever your life circumstances are at this time. You may be dealing with loneliness, sorrow, loss,



fear, confusion, or darkness. Or it is illness, old age, disability, uncertainty, feel lost, betrayed, disappointed, overwhelmed, joy or gratitude. These are the locked doors in your life, the closed doors of our hearts. Whatever it is keeping you behind these locked doors this is where Jesus shows up.

Let Jesus unlock these doors, let him breathe peace, hope, courage, and strength in you. Let Jesus open whatever doors are locked in your life and start your story of the resurrection. Remember if we stay behind closed doors we may feel safe, but it keeps us from the people, the events, and experiences that we need to grow into the selves we were meant to become. Let the one who took down fear and defeated death unlock those doors. He will assure us that we are safe and that it is going to be alright. Take a deep breath, take it all in and let Him breathe new life in you. Be a new creation. Remember what Jesus said to the disciples when they saw him, and he showed them his hands and his side? **"Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you."**

On Divine Mercy Sunday, Jesus wants nothing more than to reveal himself to us, dispel our doubts, and lead us to freedom and peace. **"Lord, I trust in you."**

**Mass Stipend Guidelines**

The practice of requesting a Mass to be offered for loved ones, living or deceased, is a beautiful and meaningful part of our Catholic tradition. In our Catholic Parish, there are many requests for scheduling such Mass intentions. It is important to remember that these Masses are prayers for the living or deceased we wish to honor and remember.

- In the past, the Diocese of Crookston had a set offering of \$5 for each Mass. Effective April 17, 2022, the Diocese of Crookston has changed the offering to \$10 to the priest who is celebrating the Mass. These monies are deposited in a special account of our parish called the Mass Stipend Account.
- According to the Code of Canon Law (Canon 953) we must offer Mass for the scheduled intention within one year's time. Offerings for Masses that cannot be celebrated at our parish within one year must be forwarded to the Missions Office of our Diocese. Thus, priests in the missions who lack Mass offerings (see Code of Canon Law 953, 956) will offer these Masses.
- One Mass every Sunday by the pastor must be scheduled for the intentions of our parishioners known as "Pro Populo" (For the People) as required by Canon Law and diocesan statute.
