Mass Stipend Guidelines

The practice of requesting a Mass to be offered for loved ones, living or deceased, is a beautiful and meaningful part of our Catholic tradition. In our Catholic Parish, there are many requests for scheduling such Mass intentions. It is important to remember that these Masses are prayers for the living or deceased we wish to honor and remember.

- In the past, the Diocese of Crookston had a set offering of \$5 for each Mass. Effective April 17, 2022, the Diocese of Crookston has changed the offering to \$10 to the priest who is celebrating the Mass. These monies are deposited in a special account of our parish called the Mass Stipend Account.
- According to the Code of Canon Law (Canon 953) we must offer Mass for the scheduled intention within one year's time. Offerings for Masses that cannot be celebrated at our parish within one year must be forwarded to the Missions Office of our Diocese. Thus, priests in the missions who lack Mass offerings (see Code of Canon Law 953, 956) will offer these Masses.
- One Mass every Sunday by the pastor must be scheduled for the intentions of our parishioners known as "Pro Populo" (For the People) as required by Canon Law and diocesan statute.

Thursday, May 5th, is a national day of prayer - First Lutheran Church of Detroit Lakes MN, is having a prayer service at 12 noon, to pray for many areas including: family, church, government, military, education, any many others. Deacon Gary will be there to represent Holy Rosary and you are invited to attend this service.

Greetings on the 3rd Sunday of Easter, Alleluia!

Sunday through Wednesday of this week the Bishop and all the Priests of the Diocese of Crookston will be gathered in Bemidji. Pray for us as we grow in knowledge and fellowship.

This weekend we celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation. Please keep our confirmands in prayer. Pray they will frequently use the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit during their lives.

I was reviewing a social justice paper from my seminary days and found this quote from Thomas Merton: "The importance of detachment from things, the importance of poverty, is that we are supposed to be free from things that we might prefer to people. Wherever things have become more important than people, we are in trouble. That is the crux of the whole matter." It is embarrassing to say that at different times in my life I have found myself preferring things over people. It is so easy to do. It happens without any forethought. It is my prayer the Lord opens our eyes to preferring His people over things...

May is a month of Mary. Do you remember a May crowning from your youth?

Each year we prepare for a busy marriage season, as priests we go through the marriage preparation files. Checking to see that the FOCCUS is completed, Engaged Encounter is set, the liturgy is prepared, and all of the formal paperwork is ready. It is a joy to visit with couples who are in love and ready to proclaim that love publicly.

When a couple comes to the Church for marriage, they are consenting to three important conditions. They are: (1) being open to the procreation and education of children, (2) to a permanent relationship and (3) to being faithful. All marriages are presumed valid and all three of these points must be valid for the marriage to be considered sacramental by the Church.

It is unfortunate that not all marriages are made in heaven. Not all marriages are peaceful. Divorce does happen and the Church recognizes the hurt and suffering that comes with a divorce. It can affect all members of the family in differing ways. Sometimes one of the parties wishes to remarry and seeks what is known as an annulment but is really called a Statement of Nullity.

A Statement of Nullity is granted if one or more of the essential elements of marriage are absent from the beginning of the marriage. Many questions are asked, testimony is sought to help the Tribunal (the Church officials that hear the cases) make a determination as to the Sacramentality of the marriage. They start with basic questions: Did you intend to be faithful? Did you intend to offer your life for the good of your spouse? Did you intend to be open to children? Did you intend that your relationship be permanent? Were you mature enough to understand what you were agreeing to, and not be pressured into the marriage? Was there a pregnancy, family pressure or a military obligation that compromised your ability to make the decision? Consent must be considered carefully and given freely in a valid marriage. Did you believe divorce would be an acceptable alternative to being in an unhappy relationship?

A question frequently asked of the Church is: Does getting an annulment mean I was never married? The answer is simple: Civilly, you were married. You went through a ceremony, pledged yourselves to each other, perhaps had children and built a home and a life together. Now you are divorced and are no longer civilly married. It is important to note that your children are legitimate. The Catholic Church believes each child to be a gift from God; therefore, the law of the Catholic Church states that children born of a marriage that is later declared invalid are legitimate. This decision of invalidity is not a moral judgment on the lives of the parties involved and it does not attribute blame to either party.

In our Diocese the cost of an Annulment is covered entirely by the Diocese, funded through the Diocesan Annual Appeal. (DAA). The Diocese wants all participants in the process to be able to fully live out their lives as practicing Catholics. I can discuss the question of the reception of the Holy Eucharist as a divorced person, do not rely on street information.

I invite you not to stay away from the Church and the Sacraments; we can discuss any situation in which you may find yourself involved. Maybe it is for you, maybe it is for a friend, I am open to visiting with anyone who has questions or would like to explore the possibility of straightening out their marital status to come and speak about it. I can answer your questions. When you are ready, I will help you through the process. When the process is completed, you will find a sense of peace that Christ can bring to a rough time in your life.

Dear Holy Rosary Church,
 Thank you again for your gift and prayers that you have given to me! In the Christmas letter I had sent to you, I had mentioned that I am based in Indianapolis, Indiana, on a discipleship team. A discipleship team is a team that is based in one place for the whole year. As a discipleship team our mission is to enrich Catholic culture and form lifelong disciples in a parish or school community. We are the first NET team at this parish. There will be two other NET teams that will come to this same parish in the coming years. Again the parish where I am doing my ministry is at Saint Simon the Apostle Catholic Church. We minister to Catholic high schools as well. The high schools we minister to are Bishop Chatard Catholic High School, and Cathedral High School. Coming to NET, I always thought I would do all the ministering, but meeting with this youth has shown me that they also minister to us missionaries. There are of course hard days since being on the road and serving others but when I have had moments with youth that have not only deepened their faith but also has deepened mine, it makes all the hard days worth it. Again, I want to thank you for your gift and prayers. I wouldn't have been able to go on this adventure and serve the Lord without your service and help first. You are in my prayers!
