A few weeks ago, at our First Communion retreat, 2nd graders and their parents reflected on Jesus' Last Supper with his disciples and how at this special meal, he gave them and us the gift of Himself in the Eucharist. We also reflected on the great responsibility that comes with receiving the Eucharist because it is the greatest gift we will ever receive until we get to heaven. What is our responsibility when we partake in Christ's Body and Blood? What should our response to God look like for giving us so great a gift?

In today's gospel from St. John, taken right after Jesus washes the feet of his disciples at the Last Supper, Jesus tells his disciples and all of us what our responsibility and our response to God should be upon receiving the Eucharist. Jesus says, "I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you should love one another." Upon receiving God, who **is love**, into our own body and soul, we should go out and be **His love** to each other. It is easy to love those who love us but how do we love those who don't show love to us? St. Thomas Aquinas can help answer this question. He says, "to love is to will the good of the other." This means that to love someone is to will (desire;want) the Father's good for someone else. After receiving God in the Eucharist, we become His instrument of love and goodness and should then go out and reflect his love and goodness through our words, thoughts, and actions to all His people - those we love and especially those we find hard to love.

If you struggle with Jesus' commandment and with this responsibility, don't be afraid to tell Him this in your prayer. Ask Jesus for His grace each time you receive the Eucharist to will His goodness for the people you have a hard time loving. Jesus will give you the grace to love them as He loves them. Don't make loving the person about you; always make it about Jesus. Recognizing that it is Jesus who loves others through us is the first step to responding to Jesus' commandment to love others as He loves us. Jesus tells us that when we do, "all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." How generous God is to us by giving us the gift of the Eucharist to not only transform our hearts but the hearts of others!

Jesus said "this is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

This Easter season has been a wonderful reminder of Jesus' unending love for us through his crucifixion, death and resurrection with the promise of his return for us to join him in heaven.

When Paul and Barnabas went through Lystra, Iconium and Antioch, they made a considerable number of disciples in accordance with the first reading. How did they do this? Just as all the disciples did, by spreading the love of Jesus!

When I read the 2nd reading multiple times, I can't help but think that John is talking about heaven, "behold, I make all things new." After all, this is our ultimate goal, to spend eternity in heaven with God and all those who have went before us in every lasting glory.

"Love one another as I have loved you" seems like such a simple task, and yet everywhere you turn, you can see there is much work to be done. This is a very big task, one that you can't achieve alone, but together, as Jesus did with the disciples, as the disciples did in Lystra, Iconium and Antioch, so you can also do here in Detroit Lakes, but not alone, you have each other, you have your Holy Rosary family and Jesus to help guide you on your journey.

The Going Forth as Disciples ministry is a great way to start this journey. As Deacon Mark Krejci so exquisitely put it, "Going Forth As Disciples (GFAD) is a parish-based ministry which forms Christians to be missionary disciples. In The Joy of the Gospel, Pope Francis calls on the Church to be missionary and that, "In virtue of their baptism, all the members of the People of God have become missionary disciples."

To simply put it, you are asked to share your story of Jesus with others. What has Jesus done in your life that has made an impact on you? How would you describe this to others? The good news is you don't have to do this tomorrow. You have time to start with a friend or two, progress to someone that you may not know in the parish and work your way to those outside the Holy Rosary family with Jesus by your side.

In December of 2018, I ended up in the ER with end stage renal disease; my kidney's had failed and I started on dialysis New Years Day January 2019. For 1.5 years I went to dialysis 3 times a week for 4 hours. Then with the blessing of God, I was blessed with a kidney donor from Moorhead, Deacon Paul Erickson. Thanks to his prayer, discernment, and answering the call, I am now almost 2 years post transplant and doing well.
