Bishop Andrew Cozzens invites all the faithful to participate in a Eucharistic Procession to open the Eucharistic Revival in the Diocese of Crookston. The procession will take place in Bemidji, Mn. on the Feast of Corpus Christi, Sunday, June 19th. The day will begin with Mass at 1:00 pm celebrated by Bishop Cozzens to be followed with a Eucharistic Procession along Lake Bemidji beginning at 2:00. As I reflected on the Gospel reading this week, FAITH, HOPE & LOVE touched my heart. What an impact they make in life! Faith...our willingness to believe that which we cannot see, to trust in a plan that we might not understand. Hope...encouragement that something great is out there for us, that times of hardship won't last forever, that the best is yet to come. And love...it is said one can't live without it! It is rare to go through life without questioning faith or being uncertain about where it's taking you. How do you respond in those times? Is the natural response to search out answers in what is known, in what can be seen with the eyes? What happens if uncertainty is surrendered to what can't be seen? God loves you so much that He sent Jesus and the Holy Spirit to help you on your journey. Jesus tells us to hold fast to what He has taught us. He gives us hope in His promise that He will always come back to us if we love Him, that He will make a dwelling with us. That connectedness is ours every day of our life if we choose it. Did you know that God's deepest desire for us is that we come to desire for ourselves what HE desires for us? It's not just about you and I choosing for ourselves and God giving us a thumbs up. It's about including Him in the journey, seeking Him in each movement, each question. I recently completed a two-year course in the study of Spiritual Direction. My motivation in taking the course was to be a companion to others who are on a journey to grow their spirituality and connection to God. Even though I was so certain I was doing the right thing, I would be hit with thoughts like "I don't know if I can do this" and "maybe I misunderstood when I thought this was God's call for me". And then feelings of fear and sadness would well up... because what if those things were true? In those moments I would ask myself if I wanted to stay the course I was on...my answer was always YES, I did. And then I would ask God if it was still what HE wanted for my life. My heart said, "we've got this". And together we made it happen. Jesus says, "Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid". God's plan is so much better than we can ever imagine.

Mass Stipend Guidelines

The practice of requesting a Mass to be offered for loved ones, living or deceased, is a beautiful and meaningful part of our Catholic tradition. In our Catholic Parish, there are many requests for scheduling such Mass intentions. It is important to remember that these Masses are prayers for the living or deceased we wish to honor and remember.

- In the past, the Diocese of Crookston had a set offering of \$5 for each Mass. Effective April 17, 2022, the Diocese of Crookston has changed the offering to \$10 to the priest who is celebrating the Mass. These monies are deposited in a special account of our parish called the Mass Stipend Account.
- According to the Code of Canon Law (Canon 953) we must offer Mass for the scheduled intention within one year's time. Offerings for Masses that cannot be celebrated at our parish within one year must be forwarded to the Missions Office of our Diocese. Thus, priests in the missions who lack Mass offerings (see Code of Canon Law 953, 956) will offer these Masses.
- One Mass every Sunday by the pastor must be scheduled for the intentions of our parishioners known as "Pro Populo" (For the People) as required by Canon Law and diocesan statute.


