Good Shepherd Sunday

Today's Gospel we hear Jesus say, *"My sheep hear my voice. I know them and they follow me."*

Have you heard the voice of the Good Shepherd.... Jesus? Do you know what the "voice" sounds like? I am not sure what the voice of Jesus sounds like, yet the voice of Jesus may come through various means.

Are you familiar with radio program on Relevant Radio, The Patrick Madrid Show? Patrick is a Catholic man who received education at the Pontifical College Josephinum with degrees in Philosophy and Dogmatic Theology. The wisdom he shares is a blessing.

Patrick shares a story of a woman he met that listened to Gregorian Chant, she found this form of media peaceful and calm. Gregorian Chant is named from St. Gregory I, Pope 590-604. Attempting to explain Gregorian Chant is difficult. In our culture when we say music from the "DISCO" or "Classic Rock," we understand this type of music without explanation. Consider searching on-line for an example of Gregorian Chant. The chant can be sung in Latin or English and probably other languages. The woman was listening to Gregorian Chant in Latin, she was not fluent in Latin.

Patrick's story begins with he and his wife searching to buy a home. They met the realtor at a specific home. Once in the home, Patrick immediately knew this house was not the one for his family. The décor throughout the home was of satanic images. The three of them continued to tour through the home going from room to room. One room they found the home owner listening to Gregorian Chant. Typically the current home owner is not present during a showing, but in this case the home owner did not leave prior to the house showing.

Patrick inquired with the woman what she thought of Gregorian Chant, she replied, "It's music that is peaceful and calming." Patrick replied explaining that the chant she is listening to are Catholic Monks giving praise and thanks to Jesus in Latin. According to the story, there wasn't further dialogue between the home owner and Patrick.

Returning back to the message from Jesus, *"My sheep hear my voice. I know them and they follow me."* Also, let's follow up with the question... Do you know what the "voice" sounds like? The story of the woman home owner, may be an example of someone that is supposed to follow Jesus, but hasn't realized it yet. Isn't it great that *"Jesus knows them?"* Jesus knows His sheep. The voice this woman heard was actually coming through multiple means... first the Gregorian Chant from the Monks, then the second voice from Patrick Madrid that knows Latin. Patrick simply explained to the woman that the Monks were giving praise and thanks to Jesus. She liked the Chant as it provided her peace and calm. Patrick offered an understanding, that Jesus is real in her life. He didn't say this specifically yet in the dialogue Jesus was made present to her, a woman with satanic images throughout her home. We don't know if she became a follower of Jesus, yet we do know Jesus identifies her as one of His sheep.

Jesus said: *"My sheep hear my voice. I know them and they follow me."* How about you? When did you last hear the voice of the Shepherd? Or maybe someone said to you, that your voice made a difference in their life to help them journey closer to Jesus. The point here... Jesus is speaking to each of us all the time. Are we tuned in to listen for Him? It's a challenge to listen for Jesus in our culture. There is noise much of the time in our lives and there maybe a sense of uneasiness when sitting in silence. It is in the silence sometimes that we hear Jesus. It's important we have a balance in our lives of hearing while in community and hearing in silence.

We recently celebrated Easter, leading us into the Easter Season. Listen closely to the First Readings at Mass. We hear accounts of the Apostles spreading the news of Jesus. Today we hear Paul speaking to Jewish leaders, *"It was necessary that the word of God be spoken to you first, but since you reject it.... we now turn to the Gentiles."* Be like the Gentiles, listen to the word of God spoken to you through... Scripture, Gregorian Chant, Patrick Madrid, a Catechist, Fr. Chuck, Bishop Cozzens, and other sources of truth. Happy Easter!!!
