Bishop Andrew Cozzens invites all the faithful to participate in a Eucharistic Procession to open the Eucharistic Revival in the Diocese of Crookston. Happy Holy Trinity Sunday!

Following up from Pentecost Sunday, last Sunday... Pentecost occurred after Jesus had risen from the dead and ascended to heaven. The Holy Spirit, identified through the wind and fire, descended upon the Disciples and they received the Holy Spirit.

My question for you is the same as Fr. Chuck asked last Sunday... Will you accept the invitation from Pentecost? The invitation from Jesus, "Receive the Holy Spirit." Did you accept the gift of the Holy Spirit? I mean... really accept the gift of the Holy Spirit.... Allowing the Holy Spirit to animate you.... To recognize those moments the Holy Spirit places in your life...

Every day the Holy Spirit positions us to respond to an encounter with people or situations. Fr. Chuck shared a few examples during the homily last weekend of where he encountered the Holy Spirit. Reflecting over this past week, where did the Holy Spirit provide opportunities for you to have an encounter? I hope a few encounters come to mind. Perhaps no encounters come to mind, if that's the case, consider preparing yourself now for the coming week to be aware or on the "look out" for those moments where the Holy Spirit presents itself. Here's why I am asking you to be aware of those Holy Spirit moments. We hear today in Saint Paul's Letter to the Romans...

Brothers and sisters:

*Therefore, since we have been justified by faith,
we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ,
through whom we have gained access by faith
to this grace in which we stand,
and we boast in hope of the glory of God.*

Not only that, but we even boast of our afflictions,

*knowing that affliction produces endurance,
and endurance, proven character,
and proven character, hope,
and hope does not disappoint,
because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts
through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.*

When thinking of the Holy Spirit I typically look for those affirming moments of faith from the Holy Spirit. It's important to recognize, and to accept those afflictions-the bolded words of the reading. Afflictions such as the past two plus years of inconveniences from the pandemic. How about our children transitioning from grade school to middle school or middle school to high school? How about reaching those Golden Years? Then expressing to others that the years are not all that Golden. How about struggling with a long-term illness, weight control, diabetes, relationships, natural disasters, concern for those in the military or the death of a loved one? Return to the reading, begin reading after the bolded words. (pause and read from above) The last few words in the reading.... *and hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.*

Hope does not disappoint because the gift of the Holy Spirit has been poured into your heart. My hope for you, going forward, is to really receive the Holy Spirit, drink deeply of the Holy Spirit. Clothe yourself in the Holy Spirit, so when the afflictions come, God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit produces within you the endurance, proven character, and to boast in the hope of the glory of God.
