

Incense: "And another angel came and stood at the altar with a golden censer; and he was given much incense to mingle with the prayers of all the saints upon the golden altar before the throne; and the smoke of the incense rose with the prayers of the saints from the hand of the angel before God" (Revelation 8:3-4). The offering of incense is a lavish and beautiful rite. Grains of aromatic resin are placed upon glowing coals; the censor is swung in a graceful rhythm, giving forth clouds of fragrant smoke. The liturgical use of incense expresses wonder, adoration, and supplication in the presence of God. Incense may be used in any celebration of Mass; it is also used to solemnize the Liturgy of the Hours and at adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Incense is offered to God and to the things and persons set apart for God: the cross, the altar, the Book of Gospels, the priest himself and the faithful. Even the mortal remains of a Christian are revered with incense. "Let my prayer be counted as incense before you, and the lifting up of my hands as an evening sacrifice" (Psalm 140:2).

15th Sunday Greetings,
We are blessed to have a permanent deacon at Holy Rosary. At one time the parish had three. This fall the Diocese of Crookston will be starting a new 5-year formation program for deacons. Some frequent questions asked about deaconate: Can a deacon preach the homily at Sunday Mass instead of the priest? What are the limits for a deacon? Does the deacon have to work at a full-time job at the parish? If a deacon's wife dies, can he remarry? If you have more questions, please ask them.

A deacon is an ordained cleric in the Catholic Church. We have permanent deacons and transitional deacons (a seminarian who will be ordained a priest in the near future). A deacon is ordained by a bishop. Once a man becomes a deacon, there's no going back, he is a cleric. Ordination brings with it an unchangeable ontological change in the person.

As a cleric, our permanent deacons are assigned by the Bishop, usually in a parish, assisting the pastor in ministering to the parishioners. Deacon Gary has been assigned to Holy Rosary. He serves in liturgies, as a faith formation instructor, assists with marriage preparation, funerals, baptisms, and as Sexton of our cemetery. They can also bless almost anything you ask them to bless rosaries, statues, homes, children, etc....

He can preach at any Mass. Code of Canon Law #764 states that in general, priests and deacons have the faculty to preach everywhere, unless a bishop has restricted that right. When deacons are in formation, they are given special classes on homiletics, and they practice and practice. Their studies prepare them for the task.

A deacon can do many of the same things a priest can do. However, not all of the things a priest can do because some things require priestly ordination. A deacon cannot consecrate the Eucharist, preside at Confirmation, or use the sacred oils for anointing the sick. This is the responsibility of the priest. The deacon can hear your confession he just is not able to grant absolution for the sins as a priest would... once again a faculty reserved only to the priest...

I personally believe every parish should have a deacon. As a pastor I give thanks every day for the blessing of having a parish with a deacon. Is there someone you think would make a wonderful prayerful deacon? Talk to God about him before talking to him about the opportunity... Lets pray for those in formation that they will use the gifts God has given them in ministry among God's people.

A wonderful story shared with me: A Blue Rose, my wife was busy, so I offered to go to the store for her to get some needed items, which included paper towels, trash bags, detergent and Clorox. I gathered up my goodies and headed for the checkout, only to be blocked in the narrow aisle by a young 16 yr old man. I patiently waited for the boy to realize that I was there. This was when he waved his hands excitedly in the air and declared in a loud voice, "Mommy, I'm over here." It was obvious now, he had challenges and also startled as he turned and saw me standing so close to him, waiting to squeeze by. "Hey Buddy, what's your name?" "My name is Denny and I'm shopping with my mother," he responded. "Wow," I said, "that's a cool name; I wish my name was Denny, but my name is Steve." "Steve, like Stevarino?" he asked. "Yes," I answered. "How old are you Denny?" "How old am I now, Mommy?" he asked his mother as she came over from the next aisle. "You're fifteen, Denny; be a good boy and let the man pass by." I acknowledged her and continued to talk to Denny for several more minutes about summer, bicycles and school. I watched his brown eyes dance with excitement, because he was the center of someone's attention. He then abruptly turned and headed toward the toy section.

Denny's mom thanked me for taking the time to talk with her son. She told me that most people wouldn't even look at him, much less talk to him. I told her that it was my pleasure and then I said something I have no idea where it came from, other than by the prompting of the Holy Spirit. I told her that there are plenty of red, yellow, and pink roses in God's Garden; however, "Blue Roses" are very rare and should be appreciated for their beauty and distinctiveness. You see, Denny is a Blue Rose and if someone doesn't stop and smell that rose with their heart and touch that rose with their kindness, then they've missed a blessing from God.

With a tear in her eye she asked, "Who are you?" Without thinking I said, "Oh, I'm probably just a dandelion, but I sure love living in God's garden." She reached out, squeezed my hand and said, "God bless you!" and then I had tears in my eyes. May I suggest, the next time you see a BLUE ROSE, don't turn your head and walk off. Take the time to smile and say Hello. Why? Because, by the grace of GOD, this mother or father could be you. This could be your child, grandchild, niece or nephew. What a difference a moment can mean to that person or their family. From an old dandelion... Live simply; Love generously; Care deeply; Speak kindly; and, Leave the rest to God.
