Flowers: Christ Jesus himself was not indifferent to "the splendor the lilies of the field" (Matthew 6:28). The Church fears no extravagance in the worship of God, devoting the best of her resources to expressing wonder and adoration in his presence. Humble and fragile though they are, the flowers and greens of the earth can be counted among these resources of the praying Church. The person who prepares flowers for the sanctuary and church participates in that careful preparation of "the large upper room" (Mark14:15; Luke 22:12) commanded by Jesus before the Last Supper. Outside of Lent, flowers may be placed at the altar, ambo, crucifix, and tabernacle. During Advent the floral decoration of the altar should be marked by sobriety and restraint; it is not yet time to express the joy that comes with Christmas. During Paschaltide it is fitting to flower the Paschal Candle and baptismal font. Flowers set before images of the Lord, the Virgin Mary, or of the saints are an expression of loving devotion. The arrangement of flowers for the sacred liturgy requires skill and a joyful willingness to enter into the rhythms of the Church's calendar. "Bless the Lord, all things that grow on the earth" (Daniel 3:76).

The Catholic Advocacy Network is an initiative of the bishops of Minnesota. It is put on by MNCatholic.org whose office is two blocks from the capital. These people interact directly with our legislators to influence legislation.

We encourage parishioners to join the Catholic Advocacy Network by going to MNCatholic.org and signing up. Once signed up, members will receive e-mails about legislation that is concerning to the bishops of Minnesota (you will not get e-mails about all legislative activity); this e-mail will describe what the bill is about and the benefits or harm it will do to society.

There is also a button one can press to go to another section where a canned e-mail is prepared to send to your senator (the senator is chosen when you enter your zip code). You do not have to figure out who your senator is; it is done for you. At this point a person can send the canned e-mail or they can modify the existing e-mail and then send it. It's that simple.

Even if one does not want to get involved by sending an e-mail it is well worth the education to be aware of what is going on. Just read the e-mails so you are in the

Very few people realize the extent of what is happening in our capital, the following is an example:

In the 1970's the push to legalize abortion was re-enforced with the statement that women are dying in back-alley abortions, "we need to make this legal so it can be done in a safe environment". In the last session they passed a law stating that a person does not have to be a doctor to give an abortion and after the second trimester it does not have to be done in a hospital.





Welcome to the 16th Sunday of Ordinary Time. The parable told by Jesus is a hard truth, that the Son of Man sows good seeds and the enemy, the evil one sows weeds in the same field, making it difficult, but not impossible for the good seed to grow. Jesus explains the parable to the disciples

"He who sows good seed is the Son of Man. the field is the world, the good seed the children of the kingdom.

The weeds are the children of the evil one, and the enemy who sows them is the devil.

The harvest is the end of the age, and the harvesters are angels.

Just as weeds are collected and burned up with fire, so will it be at the end of the age.

The Son of Man will send his angels, and they will collect out of his kingdom

all who cause others to sin and all evildoers. They will throw them into the fiery furnace, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth. Then the righteous will shine like the sun

in the kingdom of their Father. Whoever has ears ought to hear."

Over the past month, words from Fr. Don Calloway, MIC, his book, Consecration to St. Joseph, have made this reflection. Here is a message from Day 27 of the book that appear to run parallel to the Gospel parable. Especially how man is breaking relationship with God the Father, their Father, through gender ideology, marriages other than between a true man and true woman, the true make-up of the family, plus many other choices that deny Natural Law.

Keep in mind, the only perfect family is the Holy Family. St. Joseph was the only family member that sinned. Both Jesus and Mary are without sin. This reflection has hard truth that cannot be denied. As God's Children, we struggle with sin, remember, God is merciful and loving when one of His children fall, and repent from sins. Remember the life of King David? He fell many times yet returned to God asking for mercy. Family members will fall, when they do, do as Jesus instructed the woman caught in adultery, "I do not condemn you, go your way and from now on do not sin again."

Fr. Calloway writes..... Jesus, Mary and Joseph love families. Their hearts are very concerned about what is happening to families today. Modern man has distanced himself from God and attempted to redefine what it means to be a family. God established the family to be a school of love, something beautiful, delightful, and life giving, and the devil and his agents want to destroy it. How are we ever going to turn the situation around? How can we return to order? The only way is to elevate the Holy Family as the model and blueprint of the family. When the Holy Family is celebrated in society, we will again know the sanctity of motherhood, the heroism of fatherhood, and the blessing of children.

St. Joseph wants to be the pillar of your family. A pillar is a foundation. In order for your home to stand on a firm foundation and be unshakable, your family needs St. Joseph. He will teach your family the importance of prayer, mutual respect, purity, honesty, forgiveness, love, and, most importantly, placing God above all things.

St. Joseph loves the family! St. Joseph, the pillar of the family teaches us the importance of motherhood, fatherhood, and children. He is the saint of the childhood and hidden years of Jesus. He teaches modern man that the only true definition of a family that it consists of a mother, a father, and children. The notion of the "modern family" is a deception from the devil. The redefinition of marriage and the family causes the breakdown of society, culture, morals, and true family values.

In the person of St. Joseph, men can learn what it means to be a husband and a father. They must be self-sacrificing for women, and the common good. It is honorable for men to sacrifice themselves for others. Manhood and fatherhood are perfected through love, sacrifice. and faithfulness to those entrusted to their care. The exercise of such manhood is how husbands and fathers become pillars of civilization, and indeed, become holy. A world filled with men like St. Joseph will experience a renewal of social and moral order.






