
Candles: "God is light and in Him is no darkness at all" (1 John 1:5). The radiance of candlelight brings joy to those who see it, disposing the mind and the heart to seek the light of Christ. "Look to Him, and be radiant" (Psalm 33:5). Originally, candles were used as a practical means of lighting in homes as well as in churches. In the sacred liturgy, candles take on a symbolic value. The Easter Vigil begins with the blessing and lighting of the Paschal Candle, the sign of the risen Christ illuminating the Church. Three times the deacon raises it a lot, intoning, "Light of Christ!". As the procession makes its way through the darkness, the flame of the Paschal Candle is divided again and again, losing nothing of its brightness. At Baptism, a lighted candle is given to the new Christian. The priest entrusts it to the parents and godparents saying, "This light is entrusted to you to be kept burning brightly." At Mass, candles are place on or around the altar: "at least two in any celebration, or even four or six, especially for a Sunday Mass or a holy day of obligation. If the diocesan bishop celebrates, then seven candles should be used" (GIRM, art. 117).

At next weekend's Masses, every parishioner will be given a Miraculous Medal. The medal was given by our Blessed Mother to

St. Catherine Laboure in Paris in 1830. It was originally called the Immaculate Conception medal, but so many miracles, great and small, resulted from people wearing the medal that it has become known around the world as the Miraculous Medal. Be sure to pick up your medal at next weekend's Mass.

PROTECT YOURSELF from SCAMMERS

From time to time, texts or emails that *look* like they come from Father Chuck will reach parishioners but if you look closely, they aren't from Father, they are from a scammer. Keep reading to learn how to identify these scams and what to do if you receive one. How can I tell if an email is from Father or not?

Look at the address of the sender. Father's email address will end with holyrosarycc.org or crookston.org.

Father will not ask you for money or gifts of an urgent nature.

Father's normal closing is "Blessings on your day!"

What should I do if I receive an email from a scammer? The best thing to do is to delete it, and then go into your deleted messages and delete it from there as well.

Texts can be harder to identify as a scam if you don't know Father's number, but as with an email, Father will never request money, gift cards, etc. from you in a text. If the intent of the text is monetary, do not respond. Delete the text string and block that number so the scammer is unavailable to reach you in the future.

Thank you for joining us this 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time! The beauty of a Minnesota Summer around the lakes area is one of God's blessings for our enjoyment. We are truly blessed!

Two weeks ago, June 25th, the bulletin front page summarized one of the titles of St. Joseph, "The Terror of Demons." Demons fear Jesus and Mary, they also fear St. Joseph. The words written two weeks ago were meant to be a "teaser" to spark interest into the book titled, Consecration to St. Joseph by Fr. Don Calloway. Today is from "Day 1" from that book introducing another title of St. Joseph, "The Increaser."

Why Consecration to St. Joseph?

Fr. Calloway writes, "Do you want to ascend to greater heights in the spiritual life? Consecration to St. Joseph will take you there. Many Christians have consecrated themselves to the Virgin Mary so as to be more closely united to Jesus. Without a doubt, Consecration to Mary is one of the best things you can do for your spiritual life. The essence of Marian consecration is to help you become "another Mary" for Jesus, a faithful, loving, and trusting companion of the Savior. Consecration to Saint Joseph does something similar.

Consecration to St. Joseph will help you become "another Joseph" for Jesus and Mary. That is, entrusting yourself entirely to St. Joseph helps you become a faithful, loving, and trusting companion of Jesus and Mary!

In the New Testament, we read that Jesus "increased in wisdom and in stature, in the favor with God and man." (Luke 2:52) under the watchful care of his parents. Such an increase can happen to you, too, if you entrust yourself to the parental care of St. Joseph.

St. Joseph is "The Increaser." He has paternal love for you and the power to increase the presence of God in your life and take you to greater heights in spiritual life. For centuries, this "secret" of St. Joseph lay hidden. Saints, Mystics, and a handful of popes knew of it. Now it is your turn to

This is the heart of concentration to St. Joseph.

The merciful love of God has given St. Joseph to you as a spiritual father. Are you ready to ascend to greater heights in spiritual life? Are you ready to draw near to Jesus and Mary, and experience increase in virtue? Let's go to Joseph!"

Fr. Calloway has found a hidden treasure with the Consecration to St. Joseph. A devotion to St. Joseph has existed for centuries...sadly the devotion fell by the wayside. Consider picking up this 33-day consecration to St. Joseph, "The Increaser," to assist you on life's journey. Then, going forward, renew the consecration yearly. The first year may be the toughest 33 days to complete the consecration. Possibly due to the evil one's attempt to discourage completing the consecration. The years following are not nearly as difficult. My guess is... St. Joseph, "The Increaser," is aiding in the journey. I was amazed with both the Consecration to St. Joseph and the True Devotion to Mary how much easier the yearly renewal of these devotions is less a struggle than the first year. It is highly probable that both Mary and St. Joseph are making themselves known as to how they could impact the life journey.




