The Responsorial Psalm

The unfolding of your words gives light" (Psalm 118:130). The Book of Psalms, also called the Psalter, is a collection of 150 poem-songs inspired by the Holy Spirit and entrusted to Israel in view of the day when Jesus, the Son of God, would use them to express his own prayer to the Father. The Church sings the psalms and, like Christ her Head, finds in them the expression of her own prayer. Psalm singing marks or accompanies various moments of the Mass. The responsorial Psalm chanted after the first reading is one such moment. The text of the responsorial Psalm is given in the Lectionary. Psalms are best chanted to a simple melody that allows the sacred text to speak for itself. The Psalmist or Cantor sing the verses of the responsorial Psalm from the ambo, signifying that the Psalm, like the reading that preceded it, is the Word of God addressed to his people as well as their prayer to him. During the responsorial psalm the congregation remains seated, listening with reverent attention and singing the response after each strophe. The responsorial Psalm is a meditation: a prayerful repetition of the Word of God. The responsorial Psalm is the Word of God "taken to heart."

A Letter from Father Chuck

This October is the month we dig in as a church and parish to explore more in depth, the Eucharist. The Sunday readings for the next 5 weeks have been changed. Small groups start and we begin, in a very real way, a discussion about the Eucharist. All around the nation there is a national discussion about Jesus and the Eucharist. It is not too late to join a local small group. We have 19 groups with openings in all of them. Our focus is "Why the necessity of the Eucharist" and "How can the Eucharist change our lives?"

In the beginning there was God, heavenly creatures, and on earth, humans. Gods plan is to get us to heaven to be with Him for eternity. The Eucharist is a way that Jesus chose to make us divine, to become part of us, to invite us to become part of his divine life. We cannot be more fully alive than when we are living life with Jesus, His Eucharistic life within us. That is what our faith tells us.

A reminder, there is no Eucharist without the gathering of the people of God. It is more than that, we have all the angels and saints present with us as we celebrate by listening to the word, and the gathering around the table where Jesus himself consecrates and breaks the bread for us. Each time we are at Mass, we discover the presence of God. We learn how to live our lives by listening to the stories of the Bible, made up of ordinary people interacting with prophets, sinners, criminals, people dedicated to faith in an invisible God, every story speaks. At every Mass where we eat and drink, we first listen, at the table of the Word, then move to the table of Sacrifice.

Questions I ask myself as the pastor are: how can people survive without the Eucharist, how can I help them understand that they're missing something important and significant. An Irish theologian Michael Gallagher said "the problem is that many people have encountered the Christian vision only as a tired language and frozen in time. The majority of people who are absent from regular contact with the church and the Eucharist seem to do so not because of an intellectual argument but rather they have drifted away because they're imagination and their lives and hopes have been untouched by the community, and the experience of the Eucharist." There are so many distractions in life. We live in a society where we can and try to control so much that happens around us. Only when we experience vulnerability do we think seriously about God, the church, and the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

I will admit, I'm always surprised by the grace of God's power and presence in our community. I love to tell those stories about: anointings, reconciliations, visits, intimate prayer time. I love to hear your stories and experiences... Listening to stories gives us the encouragement to go and do likewise taking Jesus into the world. A Benedictine, Joseph Warlow said: "none of us listen enough, we listened to a fraction of people of what people say". It is when we take time to listen that we really learn to step outside ourselves and be open to the goodness of life around us.

A common expression today is that people regard themselves as spiritual but do not feel religious. This is used as a reason not to affiliate or participate in the sacraments, hence the absence from Mass and the Eucharist. Pope Francis says the church (WE) are to be a field hospital, a place where those who are hurting, injured, lonely can come to feel, hear and be with God who loves them and provides for them. We are called to be the hands and feet of Jesus reaching out to others, providing from our resources, and letting them know the love of God. When we invite others to a relationship with the living God, Jesus, we provide all that is necessary for the Kingdom of God to be alive and well in our day and time.

Samantha Richardson had this to say about Sunday mornings: I have always enjoyed going to Mass, surprisingly even as a child. Now as an adult, I have come to believe more deeply in the importance of weekly Mass attendance as the cornerstone of my faith. Yet every single Sunday without fail I wake up and play the agonizing game of "Should I skip Mass this week and rather do something else instead?" In order for this game to really be challenging, my mind makes sure the other things I could do instead of going to church are noble things like calling a lonely family member, meditating or spending time helping my spouse. All things which in themselves are good and on a lazy Sunday morning require a lot less effort than going to church. This is my daily Sunday battle, deciding which of all the good things I can do on Sunday morning to ease my conscience for not attending Mass.

Jesus loves you, join us in this journey of faith as we learn more about the Eucharist... Jesus present among us. Blessings on your day! Fr Chuck


OCIA: Order of Christian Initiation of Adults






