The Collect - "In everything by prayer and supplication let your requests be made know to God" (Philippians 4:6). What is the Collect? The origin of the term refers to the prayer made by people "collected together in one place" and to the "collecting up" of the petitions of the many into one single prayer. The Collect concludes the Introductory Rites of the Mass. The Collect is made up of four elements. (1) The priest, by saying, "Let us pray," invites the faithful to make their petitions to God in a silent supplication. (2) The faithful respond by praying in silence. (3) The priest collects the prayers of the many into a single solemn prayer and presents it to God through Christ. (4) The faithful respond "Amen", placing the seal of their assent on the prayer offered by the priest. Read the Collect of today's Mass and take it to heart. It will teach you how to call upon God, remind you of what his power has done in the past, teach you to ask wisely for his grace in the present, and invest your prayer with the joyous assurance that comes from going to God "through Christ our Lord."

September is a season of change. I love fall weather; it is cooler, and the effects of hard work can be seen in the harvest. A return to school adds a semblance of steadiness, and consistency.

An important aspect of passing on the faith to younger generations is to have the understanding that the Church is a partner with the parents. We as a faith community are to assist the parents in their response to the baptismal promises they made, to do all they can to raise their baptized child in the faith. Our Faith Formation programs on Wednesdays and in the Holy Rosary School are designed to be that important

Being a parent and grandparent is hard work. It is a struggle to fit all the things we feel we need to do into a child's life. After work we also just want to come home and relax. The world has a plan: keeping parents so busy that they are too tired to talk with their kids, too tired to talk to their spouse, too tired to do anything but try to be secluded where there is some semblance of peace and quiet. I have walked the same path... but fortunately I had Valerie and she reminded me constantly of the need to interact as a family and to set our priorities. Is the priority sports or study? Is the priority faith or video games? Is the priority reading with kids or keeping them quiet? We tried to make passing on the faith a priority. Having friends in the faith we could talk to and work with was important. It seems the things we make a priority can, do, and will happen.

Quick reminder: we are asking you to look at a small group gathering that fits your schedule for 7 weeks this fall...It will be refreshing and provide you with friends who will be there with and for you during the rest of the year.

Faith is a matter of questioning & struggle. Thomas Merton made the following statement: "We too often forget that faith is a matter of questioning and struggle before it becomes one of certitude and peace. You have to doubt and reject everything else in order to believe firmly in Christ, and after you have begun to believe, your faith itself must be tested and purified. Christianity is not merely a set of foregone conclusions. Faith tends to be defeated by the burning presence of God in mystery, and seeks refuge from him, sticking to comfortable social forms and safe convictions in which purification is no longer an inner battle but a matter of outward gesture."

Many groups are putting out their fall lineup of events for us to consider. Sports, extracurricular activities at the schools, Holy Rosary's Octoberfest, Marathon for Education, Catechist training has taken place, the list is long, and choices are many. Just a reminder try and set aside 10 minutes a day for prayer... it will influence the rest of the day!

Dwight L. Moody, the renowned evangelist, once said, "Church attendance is as vital to a disciple as a transfusion of rich, healthy blood to a sick man." A study published in a issue of the Canadian Journal of Psychiatry reports a positive connection between church attendance and clinical depression. Researchers at the University of Saskatchewan found a 22 percent reduction in depression among those who went to church at least once a month compared to those who never attended. Of interest to the authors of the study is the mysterious aspect of the health benefit. One of them wrote, "The feeling is that if you belong to a religious organization, what you are really getting is just social support, nothing else. But it would appear it is something over and above that."

In America, almost 15 million people suffer from depression or about 6.7 percent of the population 18years and older. The numbers continue to climb globally. What the authors of the study discovered is what followers of Jesus have known for a long time. There is something powerful and healing about knowing there is someone who cares and who is willing to take our burdens. One author wrote. "Some ingredient of the religious experience other than behaviors, networks or attitude alone probably contributes to the (health) benefit. From the believers' perspective, they have recourse to the divine assistance and thus are less likely to feel alone with the vicissitudes of life."

Science continues to explore the role of faith in medicine, with some amazing results. One study looked at the impact of prayer on cardiac patients who were asked if they wanted prayers. Those prayed for had fewer complications than those who weren't prayed over. Another study asked people to pray for couples, halfway around the globe. The results? Conception went up 25 to 50 percent.

Depression is nothing new. Even King David struggled. But he knew how to find healing when he said: "Why are you downcast, O my soul? Why so disturbed within me? Put your hope in God, for I will yet praise him, my Savior and my God." (Psalm 42:5-6,11; 43:5)
