A Listening Silence


"The Liturgy of the Word is to be celebrated in such a way as to promote meditation, and so any sort of haste that hinders recollection must clearly be avoided" (GIRM, art. 56). Liturgy and leisure are related. In a world stressed by noise and haste, the liturgy is a space of silence wherein each thing can be done calmly, deliberately, and with grace. Brief periods of silence mark the Liturgy of the Word. These periods of silence are to be adapted to the needs and readiness of the assembly. The first of these may occur after the Collect, just before the Liturgy of the Word begins. After the first reading a moment of silence prepares the responsorial Psalm. After the second reading the Alleluia rises out of silence on the wings of song. Lastly, silence follows the homily, allowing the word proclaimed to become a word held in the heart. In some communities, the introduction of silences will involve unlearning old patterns and entering into a new way of proclaiming, hearing, and praying the Word. The rewards of such an effort will be great. "Blessed are your eyes, for they see, and your ears, for they hear" (Matthew 13:16-17).

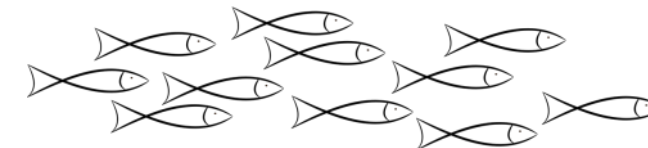

A Letter from Deacon Gary Hager

Happy 25th Sunday of Ordinary Time!

Earlier this month, Mary and I were on vacation in Branson, MO. A wonderful place to be with fellow Christians from all walks of life. One of the days we visited "Silver Dollar City" an amusement park, with typical rides, plus cave tours, restaurants and skilled crafters. We were taking a break near a large pond, then a 5-year-old boy ran up and looked over the railing into the pond where fish were gathered together swimming. The boy yelled back to his Mom and Dad, saying, "I found a school of fish!" He yelled back to them a few times restating the same words, saying the words with great excitement, and pointing to the fish.

My question to the boy, "What school do they go to?"
 His reply, "They are at recess now."



His reply gave his parents and us a moment to chuckle. We agreed that was a great response. Maybe God worked through that boy to demonstrate to us, the simple joys of life.

My hope for you, as our parish begins the 7-week small group studies of the Eucharistic Revival, we are excited to some degree as that 5-year-old boy to observe the special moments and respond in some manner to our heavenly Father recognizing that He has a plan for each of us through the small groups.
