#### The Holy Gospel

The Holy Gospel is not the mere reading of a text; it is the presence of the risen Jesus in the midst of the Church. No sooner is the Gospel announced than the people address Christ directly, saying, "Glory to you, Lord." Similarly, after the Gospel, the people address their Lord, saying, "Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ." Lighted candles and burning incense, marks of reverence and joy, may accompany the procession with the Book of the Gospels and surround the ambo while it is chanted or read. We listen to the Gospel standing, like a people thrilled to see and hear their King. Before the Gospel, we make a sign of the cross three times: on the forehead, the lips, and the heart, praying that the Word of Christ fill our thoughts, bring praise to our lips, and inflame us with love. The Sunday Gospels roll on a three year cycle: Saint Matthew (Year A), Saint Mark (Year B), and Saint Luke (Year C). Part of the Gospel of Saint John, Jesus" discourse on the Bread of Life, is fitted into Year B; the greater part of it is read during Paschaltide. "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life" (John 6:68).
