Advance Medical Directives: Planning for Your Future Human life is good and to be protected. All medical decisions ought to reflect this core belief. Yet some medical and legal documents used to define a patient's future care can be harmful. No matter how well-crafted, they can't predict all the possible scenarios and best courses of action. In each set of circumstances, we need to judge whether a given treatment will provide real benefit to the patient, without causing harm or disproportionate burdens. The safest option is to designate a health care agent to make decisions if you become incapable of doing so. It's best to appoint a responsible, trustworthy person who understands and shares your Catholic values, and can apply them when the need arises. The Profession of Faith

"Great indeed, we confess, is the mystery of our religion" (1 Timothy 3:16). In the Profession of Faith or Creed we respond to the Word of God proclaimed in the readings and explained in the homily. The Creed is a synthesis of what the Church believes and teaches, a glorious summary of the deeds and promises of God. When, on Sundays and solemnities, we sing or recite the Creed, we praise "the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God" (Romans 11:33) and, at the same time declare our resolve to "guard what has been entrusted to us" (cf. 1 Timothy 6:20). We stand during the Creed: the uprightness of our bodies depicts the uprightness of the faith. At the words, "by the Holy Spirit became incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and was made man," all bow low in adoration of so awesome a mystery. At the same words on Christmas and on March 25th, solemnity of the Annunciation, we kneel in humility and wonder, acknowledging the love by which Christ Jesus "emptied himself, taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men" (Philippians 2:7).

A Letter from

30th Sunday Ordinary Time Greetings,

A reminder, October is the month we celebrate life and the variety of vocations we may be called to do. Marriage is so important to our society and families: we need to remind ourselves to pray for and support those who are getting married, those who are married, and those who have found it necessary to end their marriage through divorce. Prayer for marriage is one way we can demonstrate in a very real way the depth of our support of marriage as a union of one man and one woman.

David Blankenhorn, president of the Institute for American Values and a self-described liberal Democrat, said of marriage, "Marriage is a gift that society bestows on its next generation. Marriage, and only marriage, unites the three core dimensions of parenthood – biological, social, and legal – into one pro-child form: the married couple. Marriage says to a child: The man and woman whose sexual union made you, will also be there to love and raise you. Marriage says to society as a whole: For every child born, there is a recognized mother and father, accountable to the child and to each other."

We also acknowledge that not everyone is called to the vocation of marriage and that some marriages end in divorce. When a marriage ends in divorce, we as Catholics encourage the seeking of a Declaration of Nullity (annulment). The process can be confusing, and some information is misunderstood. For example: one person thought we charged a huge fee...in the Diocese of Crookston, there is no charge. Another individual stated they wanted the annulment so they could receive communion again: a divorced person may receive Holy communion if they have not entered another marital relationship prior to the annulment. It is important to seek guidance and help to clarify the situation. Stop in and ask the questions of me...


November 1st is the feast of All Saints, a Holy Day of Obligation. Please attend one of the Masses at 9:00AM with the school and 6PM with the faith formation students. Mark your calendar for November 7th at 6:00 PM we will celebrate a Mass in honor of all the loved ones who have died in the last year. This special Mass will be followed by a time to socialize and share memories with one another. We are encouraging families to bring pictures of those who passed so we can place them around the altar from November 2nd until the Mass of remembrance.

Near the Baptismal font there will be a book where we write the names of friends and family who have died. We want to honor their memory and bring them in prayer to our Lord for His blessing. Bring your list of all who have died (no matter when) and add them to the book. Parents, grandparents, siblings, children, friends, those who have no one to pray for them... we would like to list them all.

When someone dies there is the pain of separation: knowing we will not be able to hold them, we will not be able to hear their physical voice. I may have used this quote from Gabriel Garcia Marquez in the past, but it still speaks volumes to me: *"Always say what you feel, and do what you think is good and right. If I knew that today would be the last time I'd see you, I would hug you tight and pray the Lord be the keeper of your soul. If I knew that this would be the last time you pass through this door, I'd embrace you, kiss you, and call you back for one more time. If I knew that this would be the last time I would hear your voice, I'd take hold of each word to be able to hear it over and over again. If I knew this is the last time I see you, I'd tell you I love you, and would not just assume foolishly you know it already."*

We offer our sympathy to the families. We are reminded how difficult death is even when we expect it. Thank you to the many that made time in their schedules to be at the funerals and support the families on their loss. Thanks to the many who offered food and assistance with the wakes and funeral meals. We can be Jesus to others through acts of kindness, especially at times of loss. Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord!
