**The Liturgy of the Eucharist**

"I received from the Lord what I also delivered to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way also the cup, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me" (1 Corinthians 12:23-25). The Mass is the Sacrifice of Christ and the Banquet of his Body and Blood. It is the mystery of Christ's Cross and Resurrection made present in our "here and now," the foretaste on earth of "what God has prepared for those who love him" (1 Corinthians 2:9) at the heavenly "Supper of the Lamb" (Revelation 19:9). The Liturgy of the Eucharist unfolds in three movements: the Preparation of the Gifts, the Eucharistic Prayer, and the breaking of the Eucharistic Bread to be given in Holy Communion. The Mass thus corresponds precisely to the words and actions of Christ: "When he was at table with them, he took the bread and blessed, and broke it, and gave it to them" (Luke 24:30).

**A Letter from**

Happy 33<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time!

The front-page of the bulletin, that I wrote for the 31<sup>st</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time centered on allowing the Holy Spirit to join you to "persevere." A quote I liked is from Sarah Coffey, "*Looking at this definition (of perseverance) through a Catholic lens, that 'something' we're doing is living our call in the world, pursuing God's will — or trying to.*" Consider beginning the New Church Year, December 3<sup>rd</sup>, persevering with the help of the Holy Spirit. This is different than making a "resolution" as we often do at the beginning of the new calendar year on January 1<sup>st</sup>. Resolutions sometimes fade away before February 1<sup>st</sup>. The beauty of perseverance is joining with the Holy Spirit to grow in relationship with each person of the Trinity. Sometimes there are mountain top experiences, and sometimes there are low valley experiences.... Meaning there are considerable fruitful times that God is noticeably present in life and there are valley or desert experiences, where God appears to be absent; those times seem dry and difficult. Yet remember, you are joined by the Holy Spirit regardless of the high or low times of life's journey.

In preparation for the beginning of the New Church Year, consider persevering in growing closer to Jesus through the Holy Spirit. Here are some things to consider.

Prayer is always important. There are many ways to pray, any moment of the day, at any place, the prayer may be quick or reflective. Attend a Mass, look at Jesus in adoration, taking in all of God's creation or even people watching. Especially young children exploring their immediate world.

Here are a few prayer resources I've found fruitful, it will require perseverance, but know that through the work of the Holy Spirit the rewards are wonderful.

Both, the Devotion to Mary and Consecration to St. Joseph, are 33-day prayer journeys. Remember, perseverance is the motto... if a day or a week is missed, that's OK, your intention and disposition of the heart is more important than following a calendar.

# ADDRESSING HOMELESSNESS AND CREATING COMMUNITY SOLUTIONS

### GOAL OF SESSION

Ensuring people of all ages can stay healthy and well is a priority in our communities. We know people want to be able to have a safe space to live, that parents want the best for their children, and that people want to live in a healthy community. One issue that is preventing some from living a happy, healthy life is access to safe, stable housing and experiences of homelessness.

A group of faith leaders and community partners in Detroit Lakes and greater Becker County, have come together to engage in community solution building to address homelessness. This group, working with Creating Community Consulting, is exploring creative opportunities to address immediate needs in the community while building toward long-term sustainable solutions.

We are excited to invite you to participate in the next phase of this process where we will:

- Explore and discuss data collected from the homeless response system, local service providers, and community feedback
- Hear from local experts on issues surrounding and causing experiences of homelessness
- Collectively create solutions to address homelessness in Becker County

## EMMAUS

### THE MINISTRY TO THE SICK AND HOMEBOUND AND DISTRIBUTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

You are invited to join us in this ministry. The Emmaus ministers will visit the elderly, the sick and the homebound and bring them the Body of Christ in Holy Communion. Just as importantly, the ministers visit with and listen to them.

As members of Christ's body and by virtue of our baptism, we are all ministers of Christ's healing. Homebound visitation is one way in which we minister pastorally to those in our parish community who are unable to attend Sunday Mass.

Pastoral visits are an opportunity to make God's presence immediate and real to the homebound person through prayer and the reception of Communion. The early Christian community began the practice of bringing Communion to those who were unable to gather with the community. Today this practice is still an important ministry in the Church. The worshiping assembly embraces and prays for those unable to be present and commissions some of its members to go forth and bring the Body of Christ to its absent members.

Praying with another person can be a very powerful means of sharing our relationship with God and bringing His real presence to the homebound. This prayer may take the form of praise and thanksgiving, petition for needs, an opportunity to express feelings, request for forgiveness, for healing or longing for a closer relationship with God and the community. Whatever the need, the minister can be a caring partner in the prayer.
