Holy, Holy, Holy!

"Holy. Holy Holy Lord, God of mighty hosts!" One can almost hear the rush of angels wings in the Sanctus, a hymn of adoration belonging to the Eucharistic Prayer itself. The biblical sources of the Sanctus are in the book of the Prophet Isaiah and the Gospel of Saint Matthew; thus does it bring together the Old and New Testaments in a single song. "I saw the Lord," says Isaiah, "sitting upon a throne high and lifted up; and his train filled the temple" (Isaiah 6:1). Surrounding the Lord, the prophet saw Seraphim, angels of fire calling out, "Holy, Holy, Holy!" The second part of the Sanctus echoes the cry of the children of Jerusalem waving palm branches before Christ the true King: "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!" (Mt 21:9). The Sanctus expresses what lies at the heart of the Christian experience of God. The thrice-holy God adored by the angels is, at the same time, the humble self-emptying God who, in the Eucharist, gives us his Body and Blood. Like the Preface that leads into it, the Sanctus cries out to be sung. The Roman Missal provides a simple melody, easily learned, and suited to its place within the Eucharistic Prayer.

A Letter from Deacon Gary...

Happy Gaudete Sunday, this Third Sunday of Advent!

Loyola Press describes this Sunday: "Gaudete, a Latin word which means "rejoice." This theme is echoed in today's second reading from the first Letter to the Thessalonians. It is a reminder that Advent is a season of joy because our salvation is already at hand."

The Letter to the Thessalonians does begin with the words, "Rejoice always." The scripture message to follow these words are, "Pray without ceasing." These three words reinforce the messages I have written for the bulletin front page leading up to Advent along with the most recent message on the 1st Sunday of Advent. Providing a seven-month rundown of the liturgical year including. The Star of the North Conference in May, located in Bemidji, and the National Eucharistic Congress in July, located in Indianapolis, IN. The liturgical rundown identified prayer opportunities.... importance of prayer, spending quiet time with God the Father, God the Son or God the Holy Spirt is fruitful, especially if you are desiring to gain more "peace" in your life.

Christian prayer through participation at Mass, group prayer or private prayer is one of the pillars to live a fulfilling Christian life. The other three pillars are... The Profession of Faith (the Creed), Celebrating the Sacraments, and Living our Life in Christ. These four pillars are best understood by journeying through the Catechism of the Catholic Church, such as Fr. Mike Schmitz's Catechism in a Year Podcast.

Pray without ceasing.... What does that mean? For everyone, it is probably different. The turning point for me came during the third year of Deacon Formation classes. It was a difficult, unsettling period during that year. Mostly all due to my own fault, I stopped making time for prayer. During formation it's important to have a Spiritual Director to monitor "spiritual health". After brushing off my Spiritual Director for five months, he finally called me out. In this case, Fr. Don T. from St. John's in Collegeville, was my director. When we met, he asked me a bunch of questions which felt like a parent questioning a teenager. Sheepishly I responded with truth, that I hadn't been in prayer, along with other events that were going on. He was able to put all the information from my replies together and within 30 minutes, he had an idea of what was going on. After further discussion he suggested that I may be in a "desert period", where I was distant from God and not in a healthy relationship Him. This happened because I stopped praying and fully participating in the "Pillars" of the Christian Life. I really didn't stop participating in the pillars of Christian Life, but rather went through the motions, checked off the boxes, and kept participating in the "Pillars" but at an arm's length.

Fr. Don did a great service for me to grow my prayer life along with all the "Pillars" of the Christian life. This transformation took place over 15 years ago. My prayer life has grown from a minimal 20 minutes of prayer each day through Morning and Evening prayer of the Divine Office, to over two hours of prayer each day. The day begins with an hour in the morning and after 4 pm each day, short periods of time adding up to exceed an hour. Days are different, such as Tuesday is an hour of Adoration from 4-5 pm, Thursday, typically evening Mass, oh and Wednesdays before Confirmation Class begins with 12 guys that are around 15 years old.... Pray for me! They are great men. I love their energy and the joy they bring to each session. Prayer brings greater peace to life, as I've made time to dialogue with God, Jesus, or the Holy Spirit. The time spent in prayer does not cut into "the things I've got to get done" list. Rather, prayer better "orders" the list, in my experience, aligning key actions to provide a smooth and organized completion. It is amazing... until you experience it yourself, you probably won't understand. Also, the "aligning" doesn't happen overnight, it happens on God's time.

We are in the beginning of the new Church Year. Plan to persevere in prayer this year. There will be "ups" and "downs" in the prayer journey. Those could be teachable moments for you. Just don't do like I did, spending 9 months in the desert period. It wasn't much fun. There was no degree of "peace" in life at that time. Times like that is when Satan likes to work to say... "See you couldn't do it; I knew you'd fail." "No, you have too much to do, pray later." But later never comes. Or he may say, "Prayer... that's for people that can't do it on their own." All of these are lies and there are many more lies that Satan can plant in our thoughts. **Mass Schedule** When that happens, ask the Blessed Mother Mary to protect you and keep persevering in relationship with God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit. [&]quot;Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. Give thanks in all circumstances, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus." - 1 Thessalonians 5:16 - 18
