The Eucharistic Prayer

When Jesus had spoken these words, he lifted up his eyes to heaven and said, "Father, the hour has come; glorify your Son that your Son may qlorify you" (John 17:1). Thanksgiving was the heart of the prayer of Christ to the Father. It was in giving thanks that he instituted the memorial of his passion, blessing his Father in advance for the glory of the Cross and for the joy it would bring into the world. Lifted up on the Cross and raised to the Father in glory, Christ became our everlasting Thanksgiving. "It was fitting that we should have such a high priest, holy, blameless, unstained, separated from sinners, exalted above the heavens" (Hebrews 7:26). The Eucharistic Prayer is the center and summit of the Mass. The Roman Missal contains four principal Eucharistic Prayers. The first of these, the venerable Roman Canon was for centuries, and until quite recently, the only Eucharistic Prayer of the Roman Church. The Second, Third, and Fourth Eucharistic Prayers were introduced in the Roman Missal of 1970. In addition to these, the Roman Missal contains six other Eucharistic Prayers; three of these are for Masses with children.

A Letter from Deacon Gary...

Happy New Year!

Yes, it is the New Year.... The new Church liturgical year began on Sunday, December 3rd! You may ask, why the big deal? Because, the Church liturgical year is written in a way to prepare us for each liturgical season.

Advent is the first liturgical season of the year. This is a period of waiting, watching, and preparing, especially our hearts, for the second coming of the Christ, Jesus. Notice the Purple Liturgical color and Advent wreath to remind us that we are moving closer to Christmas each Sunday, On the 3rd Sunday, Gaudete Sunday, also known as Rejoice Sunday, notice the rose liturgical color.

Christmas season begins, liturgical color is white, continuing to Monday, January 8th concluding with the Feast of Baptism of the Lord. Yet there are many wonderful celebrations between Christmas and the Baptism of the Lord. A few of the Feasts.... The Feast of the Holy Innocence, when Herod realized he had been deceived. He ordered the massacre of all the boys in Bethlehem and its vicinity that were two years old and under. The boys massacred are the Holy Innocents. Another feast is the Feast of the Holy Family, Jesus, Mary and Joseph, the Sunday following Christmas. The Solemnity of Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God is always celebrated January 1st. The last Sunday of the Christmas season, this year, is the Epiphany of the Lord. The Magi, upon entering the house, saw the child with Mary, his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. We move into a short period, with a green liturgical color, Ordinary Time, before arriving at Ash Wednesday on February 14th.

January 20th: The Day of Prayer for the protection of unborn children. We pray to protect unborn children from being aborted. Prayer is effective.

February 14th: You may notice that Ash Wednesday, a day of fasting, is on Valentine's Day this year. Yes, it is a day of showing love between married men and women, boyfriend and girlfriend or any other special person in our lives. Consider it a day of special sacrifice to Our Lord, Jesus, who gave his life, taking on all our sins so we can be "right" with God the Father. Whom we are in relationship with every day. (If you're not in 15 minute daily relationship with God... begin) It is a special sacrifice this year for us to demonstrate our love to Jesus. To help you out, consider celebrating Valentines Day on Tuesday, February 13th, the Eve of Valentine's Day. Lent, again a purple liturgical color, is a period of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Which continues until Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion on March 24th.

March 25th: is the Chrism Mass at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception where the Holy Oils (Oil of the Catechumen, Oil of the Sick and Oil of the Sacred Chrism) are Blessed and distributed throughout the Diocese.

March 28th the Easter triduum begins with the evening Mass of our Lord's supper; followed by Good Friday of the Lord's Passion, liturgical color red; Holy Saturday, with Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday The Resurrection of the Lord, liturgical color white.

The Easter Season continues until **Sunday May 19th**, with the celebration of Pentecost, 50 days following the Resurrection of the Lord and liturgical color red. The Ascension of the Lord is celebrated the Sunday prior to Pentecost, white liturgical color.

Prior to Pentecost is the Star of The North Eucharistic Revival in Bemidji, MN, May 17-19th. Many great Catholic Speakers plus the Marian Pilgrimage (walking procession) for the Eucharistic Procession begins from the Head Waters of the Mississippi River on the way to Indianapolis, IN. The Marian route is one of four routes that the Eucharist is processed to Indianapolis. Once in Indianapolis, the National Eucharistic Congress begins on July 17th continuing through July 21st, 2024.

That was summary of the next 7 months of the Liturgical Year. I didn't capture everything, but attempted to communicate the high liturgical moments of the year. Looking forward to having you join in.


