"Therefore, Lord, remember at this time all for whom we make this offering to you" (Eucharistic Prayer III). 

#### A Letter from Father Chuck

Greetings on the 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time,

Jesus calls His disciples, in a small group or as individuals. Jesus still calls disciples today, we hear the Word of God through Scripture, then it is our choice: mediate on it or ignore it. Is the Word we hear Jesus asking us to follow him or to do something. I heard a scripture passage on a Sunday, and had it answer a question for me I was pondering. "You cannot serve both God and mammon" was the phrase that took me away from an opportunity to enter into a life of politics. I was 23 at the time. I remained active and did the caucus program along with door knocking but it just was not for my campaign. I have reflected on this moment a few times and still feel a sense of relief that I made the right choice. I am asking you to reflect on how Jesus has called you and how have you responded. There is a great daily meditation book, "Jesus Calling" ...

Lenten opportunities: The small groups that met and shared the video series about Jesus in the Eucharist, all report they would like to do something again for the Lenten season. Deacon Gary, Bryan Malone, and I are working on setting up a different series that can be used by small groups. Watch for the opportunity to sign up to join a small group, maybe a different time or with all new faces. If you missed the last time you will want to join this time...

Scams: Barely into January and 3 brushes with scam artists already. A clever email arrived using a staff member's name, addressed to another staff member asking to move her payroll deposit to a different bank account. They even provided the new routing number.

Two parishioners came to Mass on Sunday telling me they had been sent information via text that I need help getting gift cards. They were asked to purchase the card and send the information to the text number so I could give it to someone... I would never ask anyone to do that.... Be careful...

I had set my parish credit card to notify me when the card was used and not present. There were 4 attempts in 4 minutes with a decreasing value on the items to be purchased online. I called the card company and we decided to cancel the card to stop the attempts. Be alert and safe out there, someone will try and take advantage.

Here are a couple stories that can bring a smile.

There was a story about a man named Charlie who was quite a selfish and inconsiderate husband. Even though both he and his wife worked, he never helped at home with the cleaning, cooking or with the children. He expected supper on the table promptly every evening and watched television all evening long while his wife kept the entire home in order. One day while Charlie was in the doctor's waiting room, he read an article in a magazine that said - If women were not so tired in the evening, they would be more romantic with their husbands. Well, the next day when Charlie's wife got home, she had quite a surprise. She found supper cooked and warming on the stove. She found the dining table set with the good China, napkins and candles. Charlie had also done 2 sets of laundry and a third load was in the dryer. The house was also swept, and the carpets vacuumed. The following morning Charlie's wife was telling her friends at work about the article and everything that Charlie did. She continued "After dinner Charlie did all the dishes, helped the children with their homework and even gave them a bath and put them to bed. I had a wonderful evening!" Her friends were impressed but wanted to know about the romantic part of the evening after the kids were in bed. "Oh" she said, "That part didn't work out very well.... Charlie was too tired!"

A one-dollar coin met a twenty-dollar bill and said, "Hey, where have you been? I haven't seen you around here much." The twenty answered, "I've been hanging out at the casinos, went on a cruise and did the rounds of the ship, back to the United States for a while, went to a couple of baseball games, to the mall, that kind of stuff.
