The Rite of Peace

"Peace I leave you, my peace I give you; not as the world gives do I give you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid" (John 14:27). Peace descends from above; it is the gift by which Christ himself prepares us to become one in the sacrament of his Body and Blood. By coming together for the Eucharist, we demonstrate our readiness to forgive each other, to accept the peace of Christ into our hearts and to exchange it with one another. The exchange of "the peace" is not the expression of mere good wishes. It is the outward sign of a gift inwardly received and as such is marked by reverence and dignity. "The priest may give the sign of peace to the ministers but always remains within the sanctuary, so as not to disturb the celebration" (GIRM, art. 154). At the same time, "it is appropriate that each person offer the sign of peace only to those who are nearest and in a sober manner" (GIRM, art. 82). "While the sign of peace is being given, one may say, The peace of the Lord be with you always, to which the response is Amen" (GIRM, art. 154)





A Letter from Deacon Gary

The 6th Sunday of Ordinary Time...

This Wednesday we begin a new season of the Liturgical Year, the Season of Lent. Since the beginning of this Church Year, the first part of December 2023, I've emphasized the numerous beginnings or it could be considered as moments to start over. Utilize these transitions in the Liturgical Year to start over to grow habits of virtue leading to Holiness.... with the help of the Holy Spirit... you are not on your own to increase your habits of virtue. The Four Cardinal Virtues of Prudence, Justice, Fortitude and Temperance, plus the Three Theological Virtues of Faith, Hope and Love (Charity). Pick one or two virtues to include in daily prayer, then listen for God's response. Keep in mind, God will respond when He is ready, not when you are ready.

The Lenten Small Groups is one of those moments to grow in Holiness. Review the schedule below for a weekday and time that could fit your schedule. The small groups are using a video series by Edward Sri, No Greater Love: A Biblical Walk-Through Christ's Passion also narrated by Edward Sri. The 5-session series begins at the Garden of Gethsemane. Best I stop here as to not ruin the plot. Again, no preparation or homework as we experienced from the Eucharistic Revival videos this past fall. Sign up at either entrance of the church - in the Welcoming Center or the Lake Avenue entrance.

The Gospel reading today finishes with great news... The man is cured of leprosy and tells everyone! Here's a "What if" scenario... What if, after the Star of the North Eucharistic Congress, held in Bemidji, May 17-19, then people you know return with great news and they share this news with everyone? They had a life changing experience that helped them to grow in Holiness, through a greater understanding of Jesus in the Eucharist, increased sense of peace in their life, and an expression of joy that is transmitted to everyone near them. How do I know that is going to happen? Truthfully, I don't know. What I do know, is that the Holy Spirit is doing amazing things in lives of family, friends, and neighbors during these years of the Eucharistic Revival. So, What If... you attended the conference? This means risking 3 days of your life to grow in Holiness. Personally, these days in May cannot come soon enough for me. I am convinced that this time will be monumental quantum leap to grow in relationship with Jesus. The North Star Eucharistic Congress is building towards an even greater moment of growing in Holiness... July 17-21, 2024, Indianapolis, IN. Both Mary and I are also attending the Indianapolis Conference, to further grow in relationship with Jesus in the Eucharist... growing in Holiness.


