The Breaking of the Bread

"Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread" (1 Corinthians 10:17). There was something unforgettable in the way Jesus broke the bread at the Last Supper and again for the disciples encountered on the road to Emmaus. "He was known to them in the breaking of the bread" (Luke 14:35). The Bread of Life is broken to be given to the many, bringing into the unity of a single body all who receive it. The priest breaks a piece from the host and puts it into the chalice to signify that in Holy Communion we receive Christ's living and glorious Body. He begins the breaking of the Bread after the sign of peace and carries it out with reverence. "This rite is reserved to the priest and the deacon" (GIRM, art. 83). Even after the breaking, each fragment of the Eucharistic Bread is the whole Christ. During the breaking of the Bread, the choir or cantor sing the supplication to the Lamb of God, the Agnus Dei, to which the people respond. The invocation may be repeated until the rite is completed. At the last repetition the people respond, "grant us peace."



A Letter from Father Chuck..

Do we believe that God can and will transform us if we invite Him in? A good Lenten season cracks us open, turns us around, and crumbles the hardness of our heart. How can we make a difference in our relationships with others, with God and with ourselves? The church offers us three ways:

Almsgiving is another word for charity... meaning outreach to others; I can become more charitable in how I talk about or to others. I can give some of those clothes packed in my closet to the needy, I can organize a neighbor or two to help me in donating time or energy to the food shelf especially in the month of March, there are so many ways to be charitable... Remember I talked about my granddaughter giving away 1 item a day from her bedroom. At the end of 40 days, she will have let go of possessions that had possession of her.

<u>Prayer</u> is a way to connect with God. Prayer repairs our relationship to God, especially when we may have been forgetful to say: thanks, wow, oops, sorry. We pray in thought and word when we open our lives, our desires, our appreciation of His presence in our lives and reflect on how we have seen Him present in the world. For some reason God does not tire of hearing our voice... He wants us to also spend a little time waiting for Him to respond to our conversation. Prayer is a two-way street. This Sunday, I will present you with a simple way to share prayer. I will place information sheets on this process, in each of the entries.

Fasting repairs our relationship with ourselves. The hardest person to say no to is ourselves. Our desires take charge and help us find ways to justify our feelings and wants. Our senses take charge, and we find we desire more and more of something that is not good for us. Why do we give up sweets, pop, and meat on Fridays? It is to teach us that we have control over our body; we make the choice we are not driven just by desire. Fasting is a way to say: I can walk away from a mindless TV show, I can exercise like I have been asked to do by my doctor or nurse, I can get fresh air instead of staying inside feeling sorry for myself... Fasting is such a wonderful way to feel good about ourselves and practice self-discipline.

I challenge all families to say no to electronics and screens, be a family unplugged for one evening, or just 2 hours and spend the time in games or a conversation. Here is an important thought to share as a family: regarding the needs of the family, we need to say no to some things to be good at family things. Imagine if a family shared with one another: three things they are thankful to God for that happened during the day.

Have you ever contemplated the difference between pleasure and happiness? A favorite definition is pleasure is temporary and personal happiness is what we strive for.

The most authentic action in Lent incorporates all three aspects. So, a big question is; <u>How is your Lenten</u> Journey going? Little changes repeated over the 40 days will result in developing a new habit by Easter. Have you looked in the mirror today? Are you happy with the person you see, or do you want to change something about the person you see?

This is a wonderful opportunity. God is calling you to a Lenten journey of repair of relationships with others, God and yourself. The question is will we take the opportunity or let it pass us by?

It is so much fun to talk to the youth about the "A" word we cannot say during Lent. I tried to let it slip quietly and they caught it... they agreed even when saying it with the "HA" in front of it would break the Lenten mood. We want to rejoice when we say the word at Easter...

If you think you are going to get into heaven without a reference letter from the poor... you are mistaken... (Unknown)
