"May receiving your Body and Blood, Lord Jesus Christ, not bring me to judgment or condemnation, but through your loving mercy let it be my protection in mind and body, and a healing remedy." Saying quietly this prayer or another one found in the Roman Missal the priest prepares to receive the Body and Blood of Christ. At the same time the faithful prepare for Holy Communion in the silence of their hearts. Lifting the Eucharistic Bread above the chalice, the priest invites the faithful to look upon the Lamb of God and to receive in Holy Communion a foretaste of the "Supper of the Lamb" (Revelation 19:9) made ready for the blessed in heaven. "It is most desirable that the faithful, just as the priest himself is bound to do, receive the Lord's Body from hosts consecrated at the same Mass and that, in the circumstances when it is permitted, they partake of the chalice" (GIRM, art. 85). The Communion chant begins while the priest is receiving the Sacrament. Like the Entrance and Offertory chants, it is, according to tradition, an antiphon — often drawn from the gospel of the day — and a psalm chosen to resonate with it.



A Letter from Deacon Gary Hager...

February 25th, 2024

Second Sunday of Lent

Holy Rosary Catholic Church

Greetings this Second Sunday of Lent

How is your Lent going? The answers may range from a scale of 1-10, from not so good, to doing well. Remember, Lent is another beginning in the liturgical year (lowercase), along with each week and each day throughout Lent. Our life journey has mountains and valleys. If it wasn't for the valleys, the difficult times... the mountain top experiences, the amazing God Moments, wouldn't be as joyful.

Consider Abraham in the Old Testament Reading today... This may have been a valley experience for him God called to Abraham, "Take your son Isaac, your only one, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah. There you shall offer him up as a holocaust on a height that I will point out to you." Abraham journeyed to the mountain God pointed out. Imagine the heavy heart Abraham may have had during this journey... reflecting on Isaac's birth, the first time Isaac walked, guiding him become a young man, plus the joy Isaac brought to both Sarah and him in their old age. Yet, Abraham knew to obey God. Being obedient to God, fulfills our longing to be in a loving relationship with God. God knows all that is good for His children, better than the children know what is good for themselves.

Abraham's obedience to God, resulted in a mountain top experience. As Abraham was about to slaughter his son, God's messenger stopped Abraham, the word from the messenger, "Do not lay your hand on the boy... do not do the least thing to him." The messenger further spoke, "I know now how devoted you are to God." Lastly, God's messenger speaks to Abraham, "I will bless you abundantly and make your descendants as countless as the stars of the sky and the sands of the seashore; your descendants shall take possession of the gates of their enemies, and in your descendants all the nations of the earth shall find bless—all this because you obeyed my command." Consider the event from Isaac's perspective... Isaac, around 20 years of age, Abraham is over 100 years of age. Isaac could have physically taken on his father. Yet Isaac, as it appears, willingly climbed onto the altar of sacrifice, and was tied down by his father. Isaac obeyed.

Let's look at these words, "all this because you obeyed my command." God tested Abraham... God tests you and me frequently. Are we listening? What if Adam and Eve would have obeyed God's command? To eat from any tree in the garden, just do not eat from the one tree in the center of the garden. How about after God freed His people from slavery in Egypt? They crossed the Red Sea on dry land, and then observed God's wrath on the Egyptians being swallowed up by the Red Sea. Then God brought forth some basic rules to help His people know God's commands... the 10 Commandments. Did they obey? Rather idols came forth, as a result, they failed to obey God.

Through Jesus, God provided us with "the way" to salvation. We hear in the Transfiguration Gospel reading that Jesus, with Peter, James, and John ascend the mountain where Elijah and Moses appear. During their descent after the Transfiguration, Jesus tells the disciples that He is to suffer, die and rise from the dead. He instructed them to tell no one of this encounter, until after He rises from the dead.

The Gospel reading again conveys the importance of being obedient to God's will. Jesus is obeying God the Father's will to be the Lamb of God for God's people, taking on the sins of the world. The disciples obedient to tell no one until after Jesus is raised from death.

The mission of the Church supports us on our journey:


- 1) Hearing and responding to the proclamation of the Good News of the Gospel;
- 2) Baptized into God's family;
- 3) Receiving Sacraments at specific times as we journey, in cooperation, with God's plan;
- 4) Asking for God's mercy due to mistakes/sins;
- 5) Bringing others to Christ as a missionary disciple;
- 6) Listening and responding obediently to God's vocation call;
- 7) Fulfilling God's vocation call... to be welcomed into the glory of heaven hearing the words from God, "Well done my good and faithful servant."

Go forward today to remain in relationship with God, as did Abraham and Isaac. If you haven't heard the back story on Abraham, he made significant mistakes, yet he reconciled, with the help of God, to do God's will. Remember, only two people walked the earth that didn't sin... Jesus and His Mother, Mary. As for the rest of us.... Follow Abraham's example, begin again to do God's will. The season of Lent is about beginning again, with God's help, to be obedient to God's will.

"'Here I am!' he answered."- Genesis 22:11
