#### **Holy Communion, Part 2**

"O taste and see that the Lord is good!" (Psalm 33:9). We approach the Body and Blood of Christ in "Eucharistic amazement" and joy. The Church carefully regulates the manner of receiving Holy Communion. "The faithful are not permitted to take the consecrated bread or the sacred chalice by themselves and still less, to hand them from one to another" (GIRM, art. 160). Holy Communion is never "taken"; it is a Gift received with adoration. "When receiving Holy Communion, the communicant bows his or her head before the Sacrament as a gesture of reverence and receives the Body of the Lord from the minister. The consecrated host may be received either on the tongue or in the hand, at the discretion of each communicant. . . . As soon as the communicant receives the host, he or she consumes it entirely. . . . When Holy Communion is received under both kinds, the sign of reverence is also made before receiving the Precious Blood" (GIRM, art. 160 and 161). After the distribution of Holy Communion, the priest and people spend some time praying in silence. If desired, a psalm or hymn of praise may be sung before the priest says the Prayer After Communion.

## A Letter from Father Chuck...

3rd Sunday of Lent,

Lent is moving fast. By the end of the month it will be Easter, the "A" word will be sung and said. The days will be longer. Change is happening all around us. Are you keeping up with the changes you talked to the Lord about on Ash Wednesday? Is there a change

The individuals who are preparing to enter into the Church this Easter are getting ready for their First Reconciliation. Are you a good example by making your annual reconciliation. We have many hours available.

The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is happening at the nursing home Masses this month and will be here in the parish on March 22nd at the 8:30 Mass. I recently had another anointing where Linda called from the hospital, I left immediately for the ER. I anointed as the woman died. She was cleansed of all of her sins and received the apostolic blessing that removed all punishment in this life and the life to come. Gates of heaven here she comes.

I was looking at old articles that have sat in the corner of my office since I moved here. I typically saved articles by Dr. Val Farmer. He tackled many issues of life, love, marriage, children, and farming. Valerie and I would discuss his articles and sometimes we even learned something. Keep in mind having a great marriage takes a lot of work. The effort extended is worth the rewards received. I have borrowed a few thoughts from an article titled "10 ways to have a great marriage".

- 1. Honor your vows. Life has ups and downs and the only thing you can fall back on is your character and honor. Be loyal when speaking about each other and respect the boundaries of opposite sex friendships.
- 2. Show love through actions on a daily basis. That's right, daily basis. Nothing says "I love you" like anticipating the needs of the other. Have a willing attitude when to comes to pleasing your partner when responding to their concerns.
- 3. Express affection, admiration, and appreciation. Loving touches, embraces and holding are good but how about special looks, and eye contact in conversation. If you complement your spouse in public, they will remember that for a long long time. ...
- 4. Share your daily life through emotional intimacy. Talk often and open about feelings (GUYS you can do it), turn to each other for advice, be a good listener, show empathy and concern.
- 5. Enjoy each other's companionship. Have an adventure together, do something the other spouse wants to do, make memories... celebrate birthdays and anniversaries with gusto and a splash of fun.
- 6. Keep romance alive. Surprise your spouse with a vacation, a special date night; keep the sexual spark alive... how about one flower or a favorite cake...
- 7. Operate as a team; make decisions together on topics such as money, parenting, and worship. Coordinate schedules so you can be together. Focus on being kind, not always right. If you disagree, do it so you are not disagreeable...
- 8. Manage your personal stress. Leave work or other frustrations outside the home where they belong. Plan some rest, exercise, and maybe even a little time on a hobby. If your hobby is falling asleep watching TV get a new hobby...
- 9. Be quick to apologize and forgive. In every relationship things will be said that are hurtful, selfish, wrong and unfortunate. Acknowledge the mistake and ask for forgiveness. And if you are on the opposite end of the event, be quick to forgive. Remember to forgive is a choice and you can make the choice...
- 10. Find a way to resolve differences and conflicts. Hard to understand but conflict in a marriage is good. It shows you are engaged with life and each other. Sometimes it just requires a chance to clarify thoughts and express them in a more peaceful manner. Sometimes it takes good listening and communication skills, listen, do not interrupt the other person, clarify, and only then respond. Be willing to compromise. Have a plan to disengage when emotions are hot and a plan to re-engage in the same discussion after a short break for some time to gather control of oneself.

Keep in mind having a great marriage takes a lot of work. The effort extended is worth the rewards received. May God bless marriage and strengthen the family.
