### Go, the Mass is ended!

"And the angel of the Lord came again a second time, and touched him, and said." Arise and eat, else the journey will be too great for you. "And he arose, and ate and drank, and went in the strength of that food forty days and forty nights to Horeb the mount of God" (1 Kings 19:7-8). The Eucharist is this mysterious food and drink prefigured in the experience of the prophet Elijah. The dismissal of the people by the deacon or priest is a mandate for mission. Many who "sit in darkness and in the shadow of death" (Luke 1:79) wait for the light and warmth that only one nourished by the Eucharist can bring. Paradoxically the end of the Mass is the beginning of our mission. We are bound to leave, and leaving, to labor in love, so as to return "full of song, carrying our sheaves" (cf. Psalm 125:6). The Mass ends, mysteriously, with a kiss. The priest and deacon kiss the altar. It is the kiss of promise and anticipation, something that the heart understands. The Church thus lives from Eucharist to Eucharist, "proclaiming the death of the Lord until he comes" (1 Corinthians 11:26).





### A Letter from Father Chuck..

Greetings on the 5th Sunday in Lent,

In our readings this week we are asking God to give us a clean heart. Are you ready for confession? See you at 3PM Sunday March 17th ... lots of priests...

Across the centuries, people have struggled with how to live meaningful lives and how to make a difference in the world. Jewish sages, who have engaged in the same questions and thought about them deeply, offer wonderful, delightful insights for resolving some of the most perplexing issues of human existence. Here is some Jewish wisdom for the Catholic soul. By Victor M. Parachin: An intriguing story is told about Rabbi Shlomo Heiman, who was the dean of a rabbinical seminary. Unlike other brilliant scholars who delivered their dry lectures without passion or conviction, Rabbi Heiman would shout to the point of becoming breathless as he taught. His eyes would sparkle, his voice would rise and fall, and his arms would wave in constant motion as he lectured. So intense was his teaching, that after class he would almost collapse in exhaustion.

One day when it had snowed heavily, only four students came to class. In spite of the small number, Rabbi Heiman delivered his lecture as if the room was packed with hundreds of students. Beads of perspiration rolled down his face as he passionately expounded from the Talmud. The four students were incredulous.

As he paused to catch his breath, one of the boys gathered his courage and approached the beloved teacher saying: "Rabbi, please, there are only four of us." The rabbi's eyes widened. "You think I'm giving this class to four students? I am giving his class to hundreds of students. I'm giving this class to you, your students, their students, and their students!"

Those four students might not recall the subject of Rabbi Heiman's lecture that day, but they would never forget the crucial lesson he conveyed in that response, namely, that our small acts, often have a large and lingering impact far beyond the initial event. It is an important lesson to remember whether we are engaged in parenting, teaching, coaching, managing, working, or volunteering.

Regularly I have items pop up on my screen... here is a recent one. Pope Francis provided a list of the top 10 things we need to do:

1. Don't gossip.

2. Finish your meals.

3. Make time for others.

4. Choose the 'more humble' purchase.

5. Meet the poor 'in the flesh.'

6. Stop judging others.

7. Befriend those who disagree.

8. Make commitments, such as marriage!

9. Make it a habit to 'ask the Lord.' 10. Be happy

The Pope also provided a teaching on family life. As your pastor I am asking you to use this in both your personal families and also when we as the family of the church are gathered together. He said: "Remember the three key phrases: Excuse me; thank you; I'm sorry!" Then he went on to say to the people: "In a family that uses these words, "there is peace and joy! And He asked everyone to practice on someone else nearby, He led it off with: "say it with me, excuse me; thank you; I'm sorry!"

I was asked: Father Chuck is skipping Mass on the weekend a Mortal Sin? The short answer is YES! The Church teaches the importance of

regular Sunday attendance. For someone who is unable to attend because of illness automatic dispensation is given. When traveling if you are going to be in an area where Mass is not available you may receive a dispensation in advance by talking with the parish priest. Every year Val and I would go on a weeklong houseboat trip with other couples. Father saw us coming and annually would say: If you invited the priest along there would be no need for dispensation! For a sin to be mortal, three conditions must be present: grave matter, full knowledge, and full consent of the will. Please do not put yourself in a situation of separation from God.




