Preparing for Mass by Praying at Home

The joy of being Catholic is in the Eucharist. The Most Holy Eucharist, also called Holy Mass, is the wellspring of Catholic life and its summit. The Catholic is, at every moment, caught up in one of three movements. Either one is on the way to church, giving witness to the Kingdom by preparing for the Sacred Banquet; or one is in church, participating fully, consciously, and actually in the Sacred Liturgy; or one is sent forth out of church into the world to bear witness to “that which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked upon and touched with our hands, concerning the word of life” (1 John 1:1). The Church lives from Eucharist to Eucharist, amazed by the wonder of so great a gift, and awaiting her “blessed hope” (Titus 2:13), the return of Christ in glory. The Eucharistic life begins on the way to church. Go to church with a heart made ready for the Mystery. Begin at home by reading the texts appointed for the day’s Mass: first reading, responsorial psalm, second reading, and Gospel. The references for these texts are readily available in your parish bulletin, on your church calendar, or in your missal. Let the Word of God resonate in your heart; read the texts aloud, slowly, and with attention. Repeat the phrases that strike you. Let the Word itself become your prayer; send back to God the Word he has addressed to you. Then, for a few moments, remain in silence. Adore the God who has spoken to you. Ask Him to give you hunger for the “daily bread” (Luke 11:4) you will receive at Mass. Go to church with hunger and desire; you will not be sent away empty (cf. Luke 1:53). Faithful to his promise, God will fill you with good things (cf. Luke 1:53).

A Letter from Deacon Gary Hager...

Welcome to Holy Week!

Faith Formation Students and Families, do you remember Ash Wednesday evening Mass? The church building was packed, you helped to pack the church! The full church was beautiful because you were all present. It was February 14th, Valentine’s Day and Ash Wednesday began our Lenten Journey to this week.... Holy Week, the Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday) and the greatest celebration of the Church year, Easter Sunday, celebrating Jesus rising from the dead to conquer Sin, Death, Satan and Hell. Satan was the ruler of this world since the Sin of Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden but on Good Friday, the day of crucifixion of God’s only Son, that began to change. Jesus said directly into Satan’s face, “It is finished.” These words mean... “Satan, you no longer rule this world, I (Jesus) will free many souls from Hell and bring them to my Father and redeem many in the future.” We read in scripture, “By one man’s disobedience many were made sinners, so by one man’s obedience many will be made righteous.” Romans 5:19. Then in July, the National Eucharistic Revival Conference in Indianapolis, IN. These will launch the Body of Christ, you and me, into deep waters of our country. We will bring Jesus’ message of the Good News to those that despair, have no hope, are alone, sick, worried, or that may have given up. Drink deeply this Holy Week, receive the graces available to you this week, and savor it all.
