

A Letter from Deacon Gary Hager

Happy Fourth Sunday of Easter.... Good Shepherd Sunday!

Today is a great day of celebration for many youth of our parish, receiving their First Communion today! The months of study and preparation, including receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation led them to this day. Welcome all of you to the banquet table of the Lord! May today be memorable and be the first of many days, weeks, and years to come to receive the Body and Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus in the Eucharist. The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life, sustaining one on this earthly journey.

Fourth Sunday of Easter, Good Shepherd Sunday

Another great day is around the corner, next Saturday, many high school youth will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation after years of study and preparation. The sacrament is conferred through Bishop Cozzens extending his hands over the youth to invoke the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. Next, each youth receives the anointing by Bishop Cozzens with Sacred Chrism, through the words stated by Bishop, "Be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit." This sacrament completes the sacraments of Initiation, that began at baptism, receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit, then later at the time of First Communion, receiving the Body and Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus in the Eucharist, and lastly the imprint on the soul of an indelible spiritual mark. That is a sign that Jesus Christ has marked a Christian with the seal of His Spirit by clothing him with the power from on high so that he may be his witness.

The goodness of God is revealed to us as His gifts are generously given to each of His children and youth through these sacraments. Thank you to the moms and dads, godparents, and confirmation sponsors for sharing your gifts of faith, hope, and love with the newly baptized, and those receiving their First Communion, and those about to be confirmed. Also thank you to the Holy Rosary staff, catechists, church community and extended families for sharing your time, talents and prayers, supporting these youth now and in the years to come.

Today's 2nd Reading that we hear in 1John 3 gives a hint... that the best is yet to come for these youth and each of us!



See what love the Father has bestowed on us that we may be called the children of God. Yet so we are.






