
Second Collection Announcement!

Cemetery Maintenance News

The cemetery will undergo the annual two weeks after Memorial Day clean up during the week of June 10th. Thank you in advance for maintaining the cemetery as posted. Specific dates will be given closer to the event.

Holy Rosary Cemetery

1. All single markers must be flat with the lay of the land.
2. All markers must be set in cement with a 5 inch mowing border.
3. Before installing a marker, approval by our Holy Rosary representative must be obtained to insure uniformity.
4. Flowers may be put on graves for Memorial Day and left there for two weeks. After that time all flowers must be removed in order to facilitate cemetery maintenance. The only flowers that will be allowed on the graves all summer are those that have a place on the monument itself for a flowerpot.
5. No permanent plants (shrubs, trees or bushes) can be placed in the cemetery.

A Letter from Father Chuck Huck

Ascension Sunday greetings,

I normally like to use this column as a written homily, giving hints on how to live life. May however is a month filled with action: so, I want to make some comments on a select few of those events:

- We are nearing the Feast of Pentecost: The Descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles. Think about wearing something red to next weekend's masses to mark the occasion.
- The Star of the North celebration and the beginning of the Eucharistic Revival procession to Indy gets underway next weekend. Many parishioners will be in both Bemidji and Indianapolis for these exciting days. We ask for and offer prayer support for those that will be there. In turn we ask them to offer special prayers to Jesus for those who are here at home.
- I have been separately visiting young couples, 2 with children, 1 about to get married, 1 about to have their first child. I asked about the possibility of them joining together to help form a young family's group here in the parish. It would be a way to support each other, celebrate together and get to have friends that can be with and for each other. All have responded positively. Now we just need to pick a date and have a "young family Parish Patio Party". Please mention this to young families you know and watch for the date and time of the gathering... encourage them to be there.
- I enjoy reflecting on our parish and how close we are to being like the early church. The readings from Acts of the Apostles give a model of how to be a family of believers. As staff and parish leadership we want to express our thanks to all the members of our parish who volunteer in so many ways. I cannot list all the ways that you give your time and talent because I am afraid of missing one of the areas that are so vital to us being a vibrant healthy community. It was in the breaking of the bread the disciples knew Jesus. When we celebrate liturgy (break bread) together we also can see Jesus at work in our community gathering us together.
- As a community we acknowledge the importance of Graduation serving as a milestone date for our youth. Congratulations to our eighth graders and high school seniors. As our school year comes to an end, we offer thanks to the students, families, teachers and staff for their support and spirit of volunteerism. Thank you for your example. A note to the graduates: now that you are alums, we will be counting on you.
- When priests get together, we do talk shop and I often comment on the generosity of our parish family. The Holy Rosary DAA (Diocesan Annual Appeal) is so close to its goal, and our Sunday collections can help cover the expenses of running this large parish family. Thank You Thank You!
- Where have you seen Jesus in action this week... I can tell you several stories... I think the parish is on the verge of being able to share personal stories of encounters with Jesus with others, publicly... At the latest priest gathering we were challenged: if a priest asked for volunteers to stand on a Sunday and share a Jesus story... would anyone in the parish be willing to do so? I said Holy Rosary might get a few who would, but would also have a few who would think that is weird... I pray for the day it is normal for a catholic to share a Jesus story...in public.

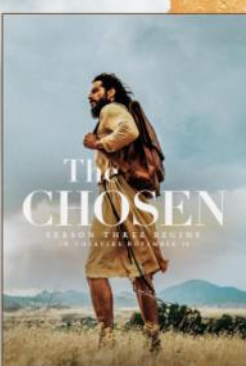
