

HAPPY BIRTHDAY!

Today, Pentecost Sunday, is when we celebrate the birth of the Church. We heard in John's gospel reading the words Jesus says to the disciples, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit." At baptism, you received the Holy Spirit... at the Sacrament of Confirmation, you received the Holy Spirit, and priests at their ordination, receive the Holy Spirit. Jesus says to you, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." You have the Holy Spirit in you to aid you throughout this earthly journey for the mission God planned for you. Below are the words from the "Sequence" that was also proclaimed today. Read the "Sequence" slowly, reflecting on the words which the Holy Spirit is able to work in and through you if you chose to allow the Holy Spirit to be active.

Cemetery Maintenance News

The cemetery will undergo the annual two weeks after Memorial Day clean up during the week of June 10th. Thank you in advance for maintaining the cemetery as posted. Specific dates will be given closer to the event.

Holy Rosary Cemetery

- All single markers must be flat with the lay of the land.
- All markers must be set in cement with a 5 inch mowing border.
- Before installing a marker approval by our Holy Rosary representative must be obtained to insure uniformity.
- Flowers may be put on graves for Memorial Day and left there for two weeks. After that time all flowers must be removed in order to facilitate cemetery maintenance. The only flowers that will be allowed on the graves all summer are those that have a place on the monument itself for a flowerpot.
- No permanent plants (shrubs, trees or bushes) can be placed in the cemetery.
