Cemetery Maintenance News

The cemetery will undergo the annual two weeks after Memorial Day clean up during the **week of June 10th**. Thank you in advance for maintaining the cemetery as posted. Specific dates will be given closer to the event.

Holy Rosary Cemetery

1. All single markers must be flat with the lay of the land.
2. All markers must be set in cement with a 5 inch moving border.
3. Before installing a marker approved by our Holy Rosary representative must be obtained to insure uniformity.
4. Flowers may be put on graves for Memorial Day and left there for two weeks. After that time all flowers must be removed in order to facilitate cemetery maintenance. The only flowers that will be allowed on the graves all summer are those that have a place on the monument itself for a flowerpot.
5. No permanent plants (shrubs, trees or bushes) can be placed in the cemetery.

A Letter from Father Chuck Huck

Holy Trinity Sunday Greetings,
We are now in the season of the Church called Ordinary Time. With busy lives, it is anything but Ordinary... life happens around us, things change, we need to feel grounded and secure. Our faith tells us, God can provide for our needs.

At the start of Vatican II Pope John XXIII said: "History is the teacher of life. History is the key to understanding." It is in the stories of life shared with others that we gain wisdom and understanding. It is in the liturgies, the rituals, the sacred vessels used, the recorded documents, and the collected stories of the People of God that we place history at our service. Vatican II also called for a full and active participation of the faithful... As a celebrating community we need to be very aware of the impact some of our actions have on the participation of the faithful.

We are called to actively listen to the readings at each Mass. Our proclaimers influence us by: preparing their readings in advance and using inflection and tone to help us listen to the "Word of God." When they bow and pause at the end of the readings, they are inviting us to contemplate the message we have just heard. They show respect for the word they are about to proclaim as they approach the ambo with reverence.

We receive complements regarding the quality of the music and singing here at Holy Rosary, we do get asked to reestablish the choirs of days past... Volunteers are important to a choir. Even with a choir we need your voice to give glory to God by singing all the songs. Our choir and cantors work hard to encourage us to be part of the vocal expression of worship.

After Communion, Jesus is taken to the Tabernacle to be reposed and brought to the sick and homebound. We kneel, if possible, when the minister returns from the tabernacle. The time of silence while the presider and deacon cleanse the sacred vessels is a moment to talk to Jesus. Use this time to thank Jesus for being part of your life. Let him know how you will be taking Him into your life situations... or simply rejoice at being in His presence and His presence in you. In short --- take in Jesus

We all are called to be disciples. We use our gifts and talents to make the community stronger and welcoming. The smile and exchange of greetings is so important, especially during our summer months with so many visitors. When Fr Nate arrives, you will need to shake his hand and tell him your name, more than once or twice. It will help him get very comfortable with the parish.

Our parish needs volunteers to help with the fall festival, without your assistance we may not be able to have this social event. The cool part is it is a quick event so you can fit it into your schedule. Are you available? Can you help? This ministry is so important to a parish family that needs a place and time to share with each other.

We are thankful for the volunteers who worked on the cleanup and spring preparation for Holy Rosary Cemetery. Their work will have a lasting effect on the beauty, care and maintenance of the sacred grounds that have been entrusted to us and that we will pass on to those who follow us. When you visit, I hope you also feel the calm and peacefulness of this sacred space.

Are you aware vocations to priesthood and religious life come from someone hearing: "you would make a good priest or sister" or "you have qualities that would help us grow as a people of God"? In the next 10 years we will retire almost 1/3 of our priests. It is a part of the community's task to raise vocations. You will want to read the soon to be released pastoral letter from Bishop Cozzens. It addresses some of the options we will need to discuss to face a future with less priests. Please pray for and encourage vocations.

A closing thought: We do not want to repeat the hurts of the past but find a way to help with healing. We need to allow Jesus to cover the wound in our heart and soul with His love. The wound does not disappear, it is a part of our life experiences, but the emptiness or hurt can be transformed by Jesus. Jesus is the answer. Jesus will take the hurt and make it into a blessing if we allow Him to be a part of the healing.

I pray daily that Jesus helps with the healing of hurts and hearts that ache. I pray that we are willing to let go of the hurt and let God heal us.
