**A Letter from Deacon Gary Hager**

Happy 6th Sunday of Easter! Alleluia!!!!

This time of year the Catholic Church celebrates and honors the Blessed Mother, Mary. The entire month of May is dedicated to Mary, the mother of Jesus, my mother, your mother. Why honor Mary? She is the only fully human person conceived (Immaculate Conception) without original sin and lived life free of sin. Also, Mary is the only woman to birth the Son of God, Jesus (Incarnation), the Second Person of the Trinity. The Blessed Mother crushed the serpent with the birth of Jesus. Satan fears the Blessed Mother.

**Holy Rosary Cemetery**

- All single markers must be flat with the lay of the land.
- All markers must be set in cement with a 5 inch mowing border.
- Before installing a marker, approval by our Holy Rosary representative must be obtained to insure uniformity.
- Flowers may be put on graves for Memorial Day and left there for two weeks. After that time all flowers must be removed in order to facilitate cemetery maintenance. The only flowers that will be allowed on the graves all summer are those that have a place on the monument itself for a flowerpot.
- No permanent plants (shrubs, trees or bushes) can be placed in the cemetery.

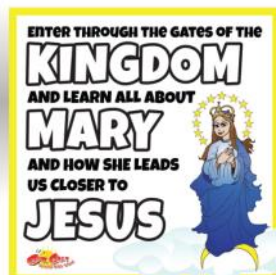

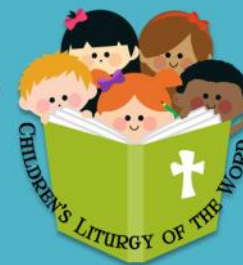
