A Letter from Deacon Gary Hager

Welcome to the 11th Sunday of Ordinary Time...

"Family isn't always blood. It's the people in your life who want you in theirs. The ones who accept you for who you are. The ones who would do anything to see you smile, and who love you no matter what." -Maya Angelou

Happy Father's Day to all our Earthly fathers here at Holy Rosary.

The 2 Corinthians scripture reading for today sends a message of much hope: to walk by faith, not by sight. Walking by faith is just that—it's faith, in cooperation with the Holy Spirit.

A reflection from Pastoral Patterns by GIA Publications is the following: *Paul wrote in the second reading, "We walk by faith, not by sight" (2 Corinthians 5:7). We cannot always see how the work we do is building up the kingdom. We can't see the destination of our journey to the kingdom. But we put our trust in Jesus, whom we trust will show us the way. Like the living thing inside the seed, we trust that we will blossom and bear fruit.*

The simple message is lived in miraculous ways. We are thankful to the Catholic Daughters, Knights of Columbus, the parish and school teams, and the Pre-K through 8th grade school children as some of the organized groups at Holy Rosary that live by the words "walking by faith, not by sight." The one group singled out for this bulletin message is the Quilting Group. This group of ladies makes quilted prayer blankets, and while making these blankets, they pray for the person who will receive the prayer blanket in the future. They do not know who will receive the blanket. Below is a letter from a mom who gave a prayer blanket to her son in faith.

The Story of One Prayer Blanket

On April 26, 2019, our youngest son Dan, was sent home from Sanford Hospital in Fargo under the care of hospice. He had weeks, perhaps a month to live. He had an infection of the bones. This is treatable in healthy people, but Dan was in heart failure, had cirrhosis of the liver and cancer in one kidney.

Dan was born with spine bifida and was paralyzed from the waist down. He was running low. He graciously accepted his diagnosis, had last rites, talked with his three brothers while we made him as comfortable as possible at his brother, Mike's home in Fargo.

I picked up a prayer blanket with prayer sheets at the church office and brought it to Dan in Fargo. We read the prayers together. Jerry and I drove to Fargo 3 or 4 times a week to care for Dan. Mike's wife, Anna, is a nurse and she handled his meds, but Mike had to care for Dan the days we couldn't get in, on weekends and at night.

Weeks passed, then a month, then 2 months, 3, 4, 5 and at the end of the 6th month in October, we sat down with hospice and revised Dan's health. Every aspect had improved except weight. He was thin. Hospice said their services were not needed at this time. What joy!

Mike told Dan he wanted to be his brother and best friend but not caretaker as it was taking a toll on him. We made arrangements for Dan to move to Bethany Nursing Home. He was very happy there. Loved the food and even gained weight.

When we settled Dan in and put his things away there was no prayer blanket/ prayer sheets. We checked at Mikes. It wasn't there either. It had done its job and moved on!

Dan lived a year and 7 months at Bethany before his heart gave out. He was 57 years old. On June 5, 2021, Dan slipped the surly bonds of Earth and on eagle's wings ascended to heaven.
