A Letter from Father Chuck Huck

10th Sunday Ordinary Time Greetings,
As we prepare to celebrate Father's Day next weekend, every man, regardless of his state in life, is called to express the truth of fatherhood. As we celebrate Father's Day this month, it is worth reflecting on the vocation of fatherhood in light of the fatherhood crisis today.

One aspect of the contemporary problem is the absence of fathers. According to U.S. Census Bureau data, one-third of children in the United States live apart from their biological fathers, and research has shown that children from fatherless homes are significantly more likely to experience serious difficulties. A second aspect relates to confusion about the role of fathers. Men may be tempted by false ideas about masculinity to be authoritarian or aloof rather than serving as loving protectors, providers, and teachers.

The crisis of fatherhood is also a spiritual crisis, which is rooted in a failure to recognize and imitate the fatherhood of God, "from whom every family in and on earth is named" (Eph 3:15). In one of his final general audiences, Pope Benedict XVI explained that God "shows us what it really means to be a 'father.' Conversely, an earthly father "helps us to understand something of the love of God, which is nevertheless infinitely greater, more faithful, and more total than the love of any man." Pope Benedict also noted that "even imagining God as a father becomes problematic without credible models of fatherhood." Today, more than ever, the world is in need of faithful fathers, men who live in communion with our heavenly Father and recognize that he gives good gifts to his children (cf. Mt 7:11), embraces them when they are lost and repentant (cf. Luke 15:20), and loves to the end, even giving his Son for our salvation (cf. John 3:16)."

St. Joseph is a wonderful model of fatherhood to guide us. A look around our community also reveals many men who are dedicated to their families and are loving protectors and guides for them. I have taken inspiration from these men and applied their thoughts and actions to my own family. I ask that we pray for the strengthening of fatherhood and marriages, and we take time to thank God for the men who have been great role models and have worked hard on their vocation to fatherhood. It is in daily life that we can see the heroes of life living out the virtues they value.

Next Sunday, let us celebrate fatherhood. Let us ask God for His blessing on all men. May they be willing and loving leaders. Here is a prayer that a father may want to say out loud for his family. It would be great for kids to hear their dad say the prayer.

"Father, I thank you for the gift of my family, for whom I now pray and upon whom I now ask you to shower your blessings. With St. Joseph as my guide, may I always be ready to spend my life for them. Bless my wife, whom you have given to me as my spouse, sharing in your wondrous work of creation. May I see her as my equal and treat her with the love of Christ for his church. May Mary be her guide, and help her find your peace and your grace. Bless my children with your life and presence. May the example of your son be the foundation upon which their lives are built, and may the gospel always be their hope and support. I ask you, Father, to protect and bless my family. Watch over it so that, in the strength of your love, its members may enjoy prosperity, possess the gift of your peace, and, as the Church alive in this home, always bear witness to your glory in the world."

Looking back a week, we celebrated the Body and Blood of Jesus. It is hard to remember that we are one body when there are so many signs of division among people. Divisions are found between spouses, in families, among relatives, between neighbors, in a parish community, and in civic communities. A way to begin to heal division is for someone to ask for forgiveness. Jesus gives us an example of how to respond to someone who acknowledges their faults and asks for forgiveness. Jesus reminds us that the two great commandments are: to love God with your whole heart, mind, and soul and to love your neighbor as yourself.

We acknowledge that we are part of the Body of Jesus. I would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge that I am a man who sins. I ask for forgiveness if I have hurt you in any way. It was not intentional. I struggle with patience; once a decision is made, I like to move forward. I forget that not everyone is ready to move at the same pace. In my prayers, I do ask God to grant me greater awareness of the needs of others. Unfortunately, maybe you, like me, only learn the hard way.

Enjoy the summer days, enjoy each other. Jesus loves you, and so do I.

Cemetery Announcement for Bulletin

Thank you to the Holy Rosary Knights of Columbus for placing flags of the United States of America at graves to honor men and women military veterans during Memorial Day weekend. Thank you to the primary lawn care man, RS, preparing the cemetery grounds for the weekend.

Going forward, beginning Tuesday, June 11th, flowers and items placed at graves will be removed. This policy is stated on the signs at the road entrances to the cemetery.

No flowers or items remain in the ground, on the ground, or next to standing monuments after June 11th.

No flowers or items are allowed in the ground, on the ground, near or on flat ground level markers, after June 11th.

Regarding cemetery trees, nothing can be attached to, or hang from trees in the cemetery.

Flowers may remain on standing monuments as long as they have a place for the flowers on the monuments.

A unique and practical attachment for a standing headstone is called "headstone flower saddle." The headstone saddle has a spring-loaded wire frame to hold real or artificial flowers on the headstone. There are many variations to choose from. The picture below is an example.

Please keep in mind, these items are exposed to vandalism.

Recent burials are allowed a two-week period for the memorial flower sprays placed on the graves.



All flowers or items not located on standing monuments, after June 10th will be removed. Items will be placed at the cemetery shed. You can recover items there. Future clean ups will have no opportunity to recover items. These items will be discarded immediately.

Thank you for assisting with maintaining cemetery standards.

Hello, we are members of the Holy Rosary Finance Council. We are Ed Geffre, Tom Lundberg, and Lori Lehmann. We are here to share information on the status of the parish and ask for your assistance.

Stewardship is a word that is often misunderstood. In the spirit of springtime, let us use a baseball analogy.

Stewardship is like a baseball diamond:

just touch each of the bases,

it is not just to receive,

it is not just to develop,

but it is to share what God has given us.

The parish overall is doing very well. We will end the year spending about \$20,000 more than what we will bring in through Sunday collection, donations, tuition, and fundraising. With all the activities we have here in this parish celebrating Jesus in liturgy and trying to take Jesus into the world through our activities, faith formation, and school we are doing well.

Here are some interesting thoughts we would like to share.

Since January 2022 we have had sixty-five deaths. Some were very generous, some gave what they could, and a few individuals were not providing financial support to the parish. Of these nineteen have a spouse still living. This means thirty-six of those families are no longer present to celebrate with us here at Holy Rosary. The total contributions we are no longer receiving from the stewardship of these deceased members over a three-year period is in excess of \$170,880.

We have 915 families registered, and we have seen a steady increase in the number of families that give over \$50 per year. We currently have 465 families meeting this threshold, for which we are very thankful.

As a parish it takes committed volunteers and staff to operate the many programs we do. We offer many opportunities to be of service. Your volunteerism helps keep costs down, but more importantly it also demonstrates we are a vibrant parish family that works together, supports each other, and strives to bring Jesus to others. We have a volunteer app that shows all the ways you can be a steward of your time and talent. How can we help you be generous with your skills and talents?

Our staff is very dedicated and works hard to keep costs down. We made a commitment four years ago to increase our teacher pay scale, bringing it closer to the public school pay scale. We are currently at 81% of the public-school salary with a goal of 85%.

We also experience the same marketplace increases in costs just like you do at home: for paper goods, food, electricity, insurance, heat.

The day-to-day price increases along with the loss of so many faithful stewards bring us to ask that you contemplate your stewardship of the treasure God has given you.

If you currently give \$200.00 a week, can you increase to \$220?

If you currently give \$100 a week, can you increase to \$110?

If you currently give \$50 a week, can you increase to \$55?

And if you are new to the parish or visiting, can you join in and help us by donating something to Holy Rosary?

Just as we are asking you to review your giving to Holy Rosary. We have done the same and gone online to increase our donations.

We know in today's world many people do not carry cash. We offer QR codes you see on the pews that will enable you to give online. Scanning the code will take you directly to the Holy Rosary donation site. Our parish website also offers the opportunity to donate electronically. If you are not

already registered. We invite you to consider becoming a member of Holy Rosary. Upon registering, we will gift you with weekly envelopes or we can help you establish an electronic gift.

We invite everyone to pray about how they can be a part of the parish, spiritually, socially, liturgically, and financially. We have a limited supply of the "little red book" available. This book is similar to the black, purple, and white books we use in the many seasons of the church. In 6 minutes per day, this prayer book helps bring about an understanding of God's love and gifts to his children and teaches how we are asked to share that love and gift to others.
