

A Letter from Deacon Gary Hager

Greetings this seventeenth Sunday of ordinary time!

Jesus says to Philip, "Where can we buy enough food for them to eat?" We heard this question in the Gospel reading today. The words following this guestion in the Gospel reading are... "He (Jesus) said this to test him (Philip), because he himself knew what he was going to do."

Further in the Gospel reading, Jesus instructs the disciples, "Have the people recline." Despite the worry from the disciples, Jesus desires to have the people recline, to rest, as Jesus yearns for everyone to rest in Him. Then Jesus guenches their hunger to the point of everyone having their fill, plus 12 wicker baskets full of fragments from the barley loaves. Now, hold this thought. I am shifting gears.

The National Eucharistic Congress was in session from July 17th – July 21st in Indianapolis, IN. Many impactful speakers, including our own Bishop Andrew Cozzens. Going forward, I will utilize this bulletin page to provide a window into select speakers at the Congress. The full message of each speaker is available on YouTube right now.

Mary, my wife, and I attended the Congress along with approximately 30 Holy Rosary parishioners and 200+ people from the Diocese. This includes a 50-passenger bus of youth from throughout the Diocese.

We heard a message from Msgr Jame Shea, President, University of Mary-Bismark. He framed the presentation around "hunger" and "satisfy." Msgr begins by sharing statistics regarding food consumption in our country, to be offset by the increased market share of the weight loss industry. We consume, though we continue to not be satisfied, and we hunger. Truthfully, that which we hunger and seek to be satisfied is to know the Lord.

Msgr Shea continues. "God has made us incomplete unless we are feeding upon Him. We can feed on God or something else; unless we feed on God, we will remain hungry and unsatisfied."

Returning to the Gospel reading. After giving thanks, the words we hear as Jesus feeds the 5,000 men are they had "as much fish as they wanted..." and "When they had their fill..."

The men were filled, but were they "satisfied?"

Msgr Shea says, "Rather, the deeper reality is dependence on God. A relationship with their Creator. So, God became man; the true food is my flesh, the true drink is my blood."

Will I go to the only possible source? Will you go to the only possible source?

Msgr Shea said it well: "It's time for faithful Catholics to stop trying to live for God. Instead, we should start living from Him; the Body and Blood of the Lord is the source of our life, our energy, and our joy."

The messages from each man and woman, ordained, consecrated, lay person at the Congress came from those that have a great depth of relationship with Jesus. I want that! I hope you hunger for that also! I want to be satisfied! I want you to be satisfied! There is a great wealth of videos from the Congress on YouTube; listen to these faithful men and women as you go about your day. This opening gives God that moment to permeate deeper into your heart His desires for you. Listen for those moments.
