

A Letter from Father Chuck Huck

Greetings on the last Sunday Fr Chuck is a Pastor. (Retirement?)

For the last two weeks I have been meditating and asking God to help me discern the answer to two questions: First some background, I love the parish of Holy Rosary. It has been a wonderful, faith filled time and I am thankful the Holy Spirit placed me here. During my time in the seminary, I asked the Lord to make me a sacramental priest. A priest who would celebrate the sacraments full of joy, full of life, full of the certainty that this is the moment and the place where God meets his people in a very real concrete way.

If I was pressed to pick the Sacrament, I love the most... I could not do that... I love the Mass, it truly is the source and summit of our encounter with Jesus. We receive nourishment in so many ways from the Mass. But... also Baptism when we see a child given the promise of eternal life... Holy Communion where the eyes are full of awe at the presence of Jesus... Reconciliation where the persons spirits soar as they come to a realization of how much Jesus loves them... Reconciliation where we can see the person rejoice and cry for joy at the release from sin... Confirmation where the gifts of the Holy Spirit given in Baptism are brought to a fuller and richer presence... Anointing of the Sick where we see comfort, peace and unity freely given and accepted... Marriage where we see the bond of man and woman signal an acceptance of Gods plan for the continuation of creation...

The first question I was meditating on: Have we as individuals and the parish grown closer to Jesus, both individually and as the worshipping community? If the answer is yes, then we need to continue to build on the Spirit the Lord has given us. If the answer is no, then we need to make a greater effort to discern the will of God in how we interact and function in our relationships.

The second question is similar: Have we as individuals and the parish grown in and developed in our outreach to those who are poor, disadvantaged, addicted, discouraged, lonely, homebound, unable to receive the sacraments, in the hospital, or nursing home? The answer is surprisingly similar; if the answer is yes then we need to continue to build on the Spirit the Lord has given us. If the answer is no, then we need to make a greater effort to discern the will of God in how we interact and function in our relationships.

My heart tells me it is with joy and peace that I hand the parish over to your new pastor, Fr Nate. If you treat him like you treated me, it will be a wonderful experience for both Father and the parish.


Bishops remind priests that we are called to be leaders of holy, vibrant parishes. If the life of our community is vibrant, and strongly rooted in faith, our educational programs will yield positive outcomes. It's the parish community that catechizes. It is also the community of the home that catechizes. Familiar is the statement: "Parents are the primary educators in the faith". This is simply a fact. If the parents do not pray at home or do not attend church, then the children will also do the same regardless of how many classes they attend. For better or worse, for positive or negative, parents have the first and strongest faith influence on their children. As a parish, I believe, that we truly believe that. That is the reason why at Holy Rosary we invest time, energy, and resources in both adults and children.

The Eucharistic Revival draws our attention to the core of our faith, Jesus. It has also been an opportunity for the parish to study, discern, and modify programs, so it can bring an understanding and a relationship with Jesus to our adults and youth. When a person has a personal relationship with Jesus, they will want to be active members of a parish and will want to learn more about His word. The faith journey we are on can be very challenging. The key is that we remain true to the Gospel message and the commandments of Jesus. We are to love God with our whole heart and soul and to love our neighbor as we would want to be loved.

Keep telling people: Welcome to Holy Rosary! We are glad you are part of our extended family. We are a holy, happy, and healthy parish, welcome. Also do not be afraid to remind people: Jesus loves you and so do I!

As I prepare to leave: in a way I feel like Jesus at the last supper: "I have so much more to tell you". But I can close with a thought, there is sadness in my heart as I leave, I will miss all of you. There is also joy in my heart, because the love of God is present, alive, and well at Holy Rosary. Jesus loves you and so do I... or as Charlie would say: Be Safe, Be Good, Be Kind, Be Gentle, Be Generous, Be Happy, Behave. I take leave with thanks and prayers for you in my heart.
