A Letter from Deacon Gary Hager

Happy 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time!

In the recent ten days, the story of the baby sea turtles from my bulletin reflection two weeks ago has continued to be in my thoughts. To refresh everyone on the story of the baby sea turtles, as given by Sister Bethany Madonna at the National Eucharistic Congress, read below.

"Baby Sea Turtles... The little turtles hatch, and they come up from the sand, and they know they need to get to the ocean. So, they're born into this place that they're not made for, and they have this urgency to go somewhere they've never been. There's the struggle. To get there, these little guys have to army crawl through sand with flippers and in the midst of so many dangers, obstacles, and seagulls. But the struggle is really important. If anyone tried to just pick them up and put them in the water directly, they wouldn't have the strength to swim. It would be a death sentence to do such a thing. The struggle is necessary. And it prepares them for the world they're meant to live in. So too with our faith, the struggle is important."

Thoughts that came to mind...

- 1. Once the baby sea turtles come out of the sand, how do they know which direction to go toward the ocean?
- 2. If another baby sea turtle is going the opposite direction, will one of them follow the other?

I wonder if these baby sea turtles are hungry. How do they satisfy that hunger to continue the journey? Or do they have to make it to the ocean to eat?

I am sure these answers are easily found with a Google search. Here's a Deacon Gary response to the questions... These creatures have a built-in "instinct." Now that was easy.

The true message relating to the baby sea turtle story, from Sister Bethany Madonna, is that the struggle is important for the turtles. And that our faith struggle is important during our life to grow and know God the Father. We hear Joshua in the Old Testament reading. Joshua gathered the tribes of Israel, which included the elders, leaders, judges, and officers. Joshua said to them,

"If it does not please you to serve the LORD, decide today whom you will serve, the gods your fathers served beyond the River or the gods of the Amorites in whose country you are now dwelling. As for me and my household, we will serve the LORD."

There is the faith struggle Sister Bethany Madonna is referring to. Joshua gave the Israelites some options, then provided his definitive answer. "As for me and my household, we will serve the LORD." The struggle has been around for a long time, beginning with Adam and Eve in the garden, when they chose to disobey God by eating from the one tree they were not to eat from in the garden as directed by God.

The response from the people to Joshua is similar in a way to the "Profession of Faith" we state at Sunday Masses. They replied to Joshua...

"Far be it from us to forsake the LORD for the service of other gods. For it was the LORD, our God, who brought us and our fathers up out of the land of Egypt, out of a state of slavery. He performed those great miracles before our very eyes and protected us along our entire journey and among the peoples through whom we passed. Therefore, we also will serve the LORD, for he is our God."

We hear in John's gospel reading a similar response from Peter, when Jesus turned to the Twelve and asked them,

"Do you also want to leave?" Simon Peter answered him, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God."

Jesus asks the question of the Twelve after many of His other disciples decided it was too hard to understand the teaching that Jesus flesh is true food and Jesus blood is true drink. These other followers that turned away had seen and experienced the many miracles Jesus performed through these years. These people believed the teachings and the signs. Until this moment. The truth was too hard to accept. Rather than staying a disciple of Jesus, to continue to learn and understand the teaching of Jesus flesh and blood as true food and drink, they returned to their former way of life.

To everyone who believes in the Eucharist as the true body and blood of Jesus, you are blessed. If you struggle with this teaching, please come talk to me, Fr. Nate, or someone you trust who has a deep devotion for the Eucharist. You are loved, and we want to help you come into closer union with Jesus in the Eucharist.
