#### A Letter from Father Nate Brunn

Looking back to Egypt... The first reading this weekend, we hear the "Israelites grumbling" as they are journeying through the desert. Walking through the desert is a tough walk! It has been a time of trial, a challenge, thirsty, hungry, been around the same people for a long time, and they probably haven't been getting good sleep! When they were leaving Egypt and heading towards the Promised Land, I don't think this is what they had in mind.

During their desert experience, the temptation to look back on Egypt is no small matter. The temptation was to look back and see all the "comforts," to see stability, to know what was going on. When they responded to the Lord's invitation through Moses to leave Egypt, they took a step of faith and trust into an unknown. When the journey got difficult in the desert, the temptation to go back to what they knew was really enticing.

The tragedy of looking back to Egypt was that they lost focus on where they were going. Egypt represents a place of bondage, a place that held them in; the Lord invites them out of that bondage. To put it in more practical, spiritual terms for today: Egypt in the Exodus represents a place for us that is distant from God (a life of sin), and God wants to invite us to something greater.

It takes an act of faith, an act of trust, to want to walk away from those sins, those temptations that seem to have such a strong hold on us. We try to cut it out cold turkey, we try to change the way we pray, we try to go to confession, etc., and it seems like we are never going to get rid of the sin or temptation. So...the easy thing to do is to look back at Egypt. It seems like the desert that I am in just isn't working anymore, and I am not going to overcome it; I might as well just go back to the way that I was living.

This week, July 31st, we celebrated the memorial of St. Ignatius of Loyola. A saint who knew the spiritual life and tendencies well! On the spiritual journey, when we are in a desert, it is tempting to want to turn around and go back. St. Ignatius invites us to think about the moments of God's grace when in the desert. Those are the moments that we remember experiencing God's presence in our lives. These are moments that can give us energy, life, and zeal when it seems like the journey is too difficult. Continue the path of doing good; feed the virtues! When you are tempted to go backwards, remember to look forward->look towards the Promised Land! God will give us the grace that we need, in abundance, when we keep our eyes fixed on Him and where He invites us to go. Look forward to heaven and avoid the temptation of looking back to Egypt.

Praise God! As of this week, we have all positions filled for the upcoming school year!! It is such a blessing to have a full staff as we enter this year! We are looking forward to a great start to the school year (but first, enjoy the rest of summer!)

Beauty of the Sacraments: Through the month of July, I have been able to celebrate 4 baptisms, hear confessions, anoint the sick, have two weddings, and of course celebrate the Eucharist! Each of the sacraments is a witness to God's grace being poured out upon humanity! Celebrating the sacraments is a moment of joy as we receive the gifts that God wants to give us!

### **Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Coming this Fall to Holy Rosary!**

Beginning in October, Holy Rosary will be offering Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) for children ages 3, 4 and 5 (preschool) on Tuesday mornings from 9:30-11am and Thursday afternoons from 3:45-5:15pm.



Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is an approach to the religious formation of children ages three - eleven and rooted in the Bible, the liturgy of the Church, and the educational principles of Maria Montessori. Children gather in an "atrium", a room prepared for them, which contains simple yet beautiful materials that they use to contemplate and learn about the mystery of God. The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd methodology of faith formation consists of three levels for children: Level 1 (ages 3-6), Level 2 (ages 6-9) and Level 3 (ages 9-11). In October, Holy Rosary parish will offer Level 1 Atrium weekly sessions for children ages 3, 4 and 5 (preschool). All Holy Rosary parents (Holy Rosary School, Faith Formation, Homeschool) who have children of these ages are welcome to enroll them in CGS. The atrium at Holy Rosary where the children will gather for CGS is in the Youth Room area under the sacristy and adoration chapel. Parents may register their child for Catechesis of the Good Shepherd by completing the online Faith Formation Registration form on the parish website, holyrosarycc.org or by filling out the registration form at the parish office.
