
Children's Liturgy of the Word

Children's Liturgy of the Word will begin Sunday, September 8 during the 9:00am Mass! All children age 4 through 2nd grade are welcome to participate. After the Opening Prayer, Fr. Nate will call the children to come forward for a blessing and then they will be led by an adult leader to the parish living room to hear and ponder God's Word using a special Lectionary just for them! No registration is required. A Letter from Father Nate Brunn

St. John Henry Newman is one of my favorite Saints! He was born, raised, and lived in England from 1801-1890. He was a clergy member of the Church of England and in 1845 left the Church of England and became Catholic. From that point forward he devoted his life to teaching, writing, and living out his Catholic faith in and throughout all of England. In 1879, he was named a cardinal. He was able to continue his teachings and writings all the way up to the time of his death. It is from this Saint that we get the name for Newman Centers on college campuses.

St. Newman has a prayer that has been a part of my life for 20 years. The opening line, "God knows me and calls me by my name... He has created me to do Him some definite service, some work to me which He has not committed to another." The same God who created us, loves us, and calls us, is the same God who equips us each uniquely for a ministry, a calling, that only He has called me to do!

Our second reading from St. James, "Be doers of the Word, and not hearers only" is a challenge to live out the mission that God has called each of us to uniquely! That mission is lived out in our homes, neighborhood, and work-as husband, as wife, as father, as mother, as co-worker, as boss, as classmate, as a teen - God has called us to a mission, to a work that only I have been called to! It is one thing to hear the scripture, to listen to talks, to hear great words from great authors, but God is challenging us also to live those words in our thoughts and in our actions! As St. Newman continues in his prayer, "Therefore I will trust Him. Whatever, wherever I am... Let me be Thy blind instrument. I ask not to see—I ask not to know—I ask simply to be used by the Lord."

Labor Day is Monday, Sept. 2nd. May you find some time to rest from summer busyness and from work! Thank you to the many people who work so tirelessly in their jobs to assist their family, the community, the nation, and the world. Blessings to you all as you rest from your labors.
